SUBJECT: Recommending that the exemption of
Sheik Jemmu, clerk, D.S.O. office, Vizagapatam may
be made general.

In G.O. No. 70 R dt 27. 2. 07 Sheik Jemmu was perma-
nently exempted from the Matriculation examination
and the Handwriting + Dictation test for employment as
Camp clerk on Rs 15. p. m in the D. Police office, Vizagapatam.
The grounds on which the exemption was granted were:-

(1) That in spite of every endeavour the services of
passed Candidates could not be secured; and

(2) that no passed man of any other Caste consented
to accompany the Superintendent into the Gydem Hills
and other Agency tracts in the Vizagapatam District.

2. Now that the limit of salary for which educational
qualifications are required has been raised from Rs 15
to Rs 20 the Superintendent recommends, and the J. G.
of Police (Mr. Corrie) supports the recommendation, that
sheik Jemmu may be exempted "in general terms
for employment in the District office to enable
him to get promotion (Rs 20 and upwards) in due
course".

3. The recommendation appears to have been made
purely on personal grounds. As required in para 2
of G.O. 173 Rdt 10. 3. 08. the J. G. does not state
whether the recommendation is made solely in the
interests of departmental administration.

4. It does not appear that there are sufficient grounds for the grant of a general exemption similar to that recommended by the G.O.; but the exemption sanctioned in G.O. No. 70 W. dated 27th February 1907, may be extended so as to cover appointments on Rs 20, or perhaps Rs 25 per.
