G.O., No. 734, Financial, dated 2nd November 1905.

ABSTRACT.—Sanctioning an allotment of Rs. 10,700 for expenditure in 1905-1906 on account of Educational, Medical and Vaccination Services in the Bhadrachalam Agency taluk.

In G.O., No. 734, Financial, dated 2nd November 1905, sanctioning allotment of funds for the several branches of service in the Bhadrachalam Agency taluk owing to its exclusion from the Local Fund area, Government approved of the proposal that instead of the Supervisor of Primary Schools on Rs. 30 attached to the Bhadrachalam taluk there should be a Superintendent of Hill Schools on Rs. 50—2—60 who should be placed in charge not only of the Bhadrachalam Agency but also the three new talukas proposed to be transferred to the Gódávári Agency from the Central Provinces, viz., Albaka, Cherla and Nagar. The sanction accorded was not, however, given effect to as the three talukas have not yet been transferred to this Presidency, and the Supervisor continues to draw only Rs. 30. This officer now states that since he took charge of the range the number of schools has increased from 22 to 32, that, consequently, he has to travel over a larger area, that the climate is malarial and unhealthy and that the place is uncomfortable and highly expensive and requests, therefore, that he may be allowed to draw the pay sanctioned for the Superintendent of Hill Schools, viz., Rs. 50—2—60 in the Government Order quoted above. Both the Special Assistant Agent and the Government Agent, Gódávári, state that the work of the Supervisor has visibly increased and strongly support his request. The Inspector of Schools, First Circle, has also reported very favourably of the work of this officer. In these circumstances and in view of the peculiar local conditions of the Agency, I think it is desirable to allow the Supervisor to draw pay at the revised scale sanctioned in G.O., No. 734, Financial, dated 2nd November 1905, but as the transfer of the three talukas has not yet been effected and as the scheme of provincialization of Supervisors is still under consideration, I beg to recommend that he be given a local allowance of Rs. 20 per mensem so as to raise his pay to Rs. 50. In this connection, I would also request that the sanction accorded in the above Government Order to the entertainment of a peon on Rs. 7 may now be renewed as the Supervisor is reported to be badly in need of a peon.

The necessary provision exists in the current year's budget.

[SUBJECT.—*Local allowance to the Supervisor of Primary Schools, Bhadrachalam Agency.*]

In the Bhadrachalam agency, a supervisor of primary schools on a pay of Rs. 30 is employed. In place of this supervisor, the Government sanctioned in G.O., No. 734, Financial, dated 2nd November 1905, the employment of a Superintendent of Hill schools on a pay of Rs. 50—2—60. Sanction was also accorded to the employment of a peon on Rs. 7. This was in consideration of the proposed transfer of three talukas from the Central Provinces to the Gódavari agency. The transfer of the talukas has not yet taken place and so no effect has been given to the sanction accorded in G.O., No. 734, Financial, dated 2nd November 1905.

They will probably be transferred from November 1st next.

2. In view of the fact that the work of the supervisor has, since the date of his appointment, visibly increased and in consideration of the peculiar local conditions of the agency, the Director of Public Instruction considers it desirable that the supervisor should be allowed to draw the higher rate of salary (Rs. 50—2—60) sanctioned in G.O., No. 734, Financial, dated 2nd November 1905. But considering that a scheme for the provincialization of supervisors is under consideration, Dr. Bourne recommends that the supervisor may be given a local allowance of Rs. 20 per mensem so as to raise his monthly remuneration to Rs. 50 and that he may be allowed the peon on Rs. 7 sanctioned in G.O., No. 734, Financial, dated 2nd November 1905.

Under the head 22-B. EDUCATION—INSPECTION—Salaries (page 132 of Civil Budget Estimate for 1908-1909—final issue).

3. Provision for this charge exists in the current year's budget and the Accountant-General states that there is no audit objection to the Director's proposals.

4. In these circumstances the Director's proposals may, it is submitted, be sanctioned as a temporary measure, pending the provincialization of the Agency of Supervisors.

A draft is placed below for approval. If approved, it may be sent to the Financial Department for acceptance.

FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

The scale of pay proposed by the Local Government in the scheme for the provincialization of supervisors of primary schools is Rs. 30, Rs. 40 and Rs. 50 per mensem with fixed travelling allowance of Rs. 12½ a month increased by 50 per cent. in the case of supervisors employed in the agency and hill tracts. The proposed local allowance of Rs. 20 for the supervisor in Bhadrachalam taluk as temporary measure, may, it is submitted, be accepted in Financial.
