SUBJECT. Recommending the permanent exemption from the Account and Precis Writing tests of P. Thiruvengadaswami Nayndu, Head Accountant, Court of Small Causes, Madras.

In G.O. 211 Judicial dt 6th February 1908, the Government sanctioned the appointment of an additional Accountant in the Account Section of the Court of Small Causes, Madras, and fixed Rs 60 as the pay of the Head Accountant. It was also stated that the Accountants or Rs 50 or more in the Court of Small Causes should be required to pass the Account test.

2. The Chief Judge of the Court of Small Causes now requests that P. Thiruvengadaswami Nayndu who has been the Head Accountant of the office for over 10 years may be exempted from passing the Account test, His grade, and the Precis writing test and be allowed to draw the increased salary, namely, Rs 60 p. m. The grounds on which the recommendation is based are given in paras 2 and 3 of the ^{Chief Judge's} letter.

3. In para 3 of G.O. 211 Judicial dt 6th February 1908, the Govt observed :-

"That the Chief Judge must distinctly understand that the increase now sanctioned is intended to enable him to secure a better class of men for these posts and that it is not the intention that the existing incumbents should be given any increase of pay."

It is for consideration whether, in the face of the above remarks, the recommendation of the Chief Judge may be accepted. The remarks of the Judicial department may, it is submitted, be invited also.

4. It is also for consideration whether the Public Service and the Special test notifications ^{may} ~~might~~ ~~not~~ be amended with reference to the last portion of para. 5 of G.O. 211 Jnd. Ld. 6.2.08. ^{is proposed as approved,} If they might, the Judicial Department may be requested to Communicate a Copy of G.O. 211 Jnd. Ld. 6.2.08 to Educational for necessary action.

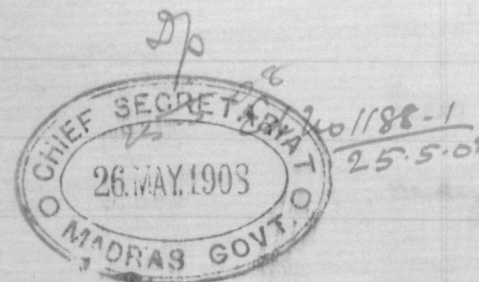
