It is submitted that the proposal of the D.P.I. to depute Mr. Stone, from the 4th Instant, to formulate a plan for the establishment of a Provident fund for teachers may be approved.

2. The vacation of the Presidency College commenced on the 8th May 1908 and the College reopens on the 13th July. Under Art. 272 of the C.S.D., Mr. Stone will, in consequence of this deputation be eligible for privilege leave for the period occupied by it. It is presumed that it is not intended that Mr. Stone should get any deputation allowance under Art. 81 of the C.S.D.
