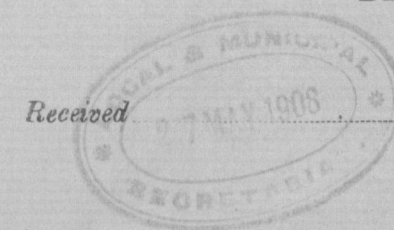

Sir,

I have the honour to state that no orders have been passed yet on this office Ref on Cur No. 785 /07, dated 30th July 1907 re. the additional outlay required under the New University Regulations. The Intermediate courses of study will have to be begun from January next and the laboratory and other apparatus necessary for the course must be completed and kept ready before the close of this year. Grants for other colleges were sanctioned long ago and they have begun to construct the laboratory building and provide the necessary equipment with a view to have everything ready by the 1st January 1909. In our case, the construction of laboratory should be begun at least during the summer vacation and completed before the monsoon sets in, in September next. The Science apparatus &c. have also to be ordered from England, I, therefore, request that you will be good enough to sanction the grant applied for, at a very early date. An early reply is solicited.

A Please see paragraph 11 of the D.P.I.'s letter on page 3 of G.O. No.810 Edl., dated 3rd December 1907, in which the D.P.I. (the Hon'ble Dr. Bourne) recommended a grant of Rs.27,000 to the Pachaiyappa's College, Madras, out of the special assignment made by the Government of India for 'University Education'. In paragraph 2 of G.O. No.810 Edl., dated 3rd December 1907, the question of a grant to this College was deferred for further consideration. Please see also the Secretary's note dated 6th November 1907, on page 9 of the notes with the G.O. quoted above.

A 2. The D.P.I. now forwards a letter from the Secretary to the Trustees of the Pachaiyappa's charities requesting the early payment of the grant and he recommends that the grant of Rs.27,000 already proposed by him for this college may now be sanctioned. Dr. Bourne presumes that the continuance of the College is "now certain" and suggests that the grant may be made payable subject to the conditions laid down in

in the case of the other grants for special equipment of colleges.

3. It is not clear on what grounds the D.P.I. presumes that the continuance of the college is certain. It is reported in the Madras Times of the 30th April 1908 that the final scheme for settlement of the Pachaiyappa's charities would come up for consideration by the High Court in July next. Until the High Court passes final orders it does not appear that the continuance of the college may be regarded as certain although it does not ~~seem~~ ^{seem} probable that the High Court will interfere with the College. It is for consideration whether the grant may be sanctioned as recommended by the D.P.I.

One cannot tell what interests are at work in the matter of these Charities or what is likely to happen in July next when the various schemes of Settlement are submitted to the H. Ct. It seems very unlikely, however, that the College will be closed & the grant need not be paid till the work is completed. If anything untoward happens the Charities will have to bear the cost.
