as a Revenue Inspector unless he has passed the Special Tests prescribed for appointment viz. the Revenue Test Lower ^{Grade} and the Account Test, Lower Grade. For the appointment of Head Clerk Deputy Collector's Office on Rs.45/- which is thrown open to the exempted men, Translation test, has also to be passed. It is thus necessary that the Clerks should qualify themselves -- by the Special Tests before they can be promoted to posts for which such qualification has been prescribed.

3/ The fact that exemption has been granted by Government from General Educational tests to enable appointment to posts for which Special Test qualifications are necessary seems to involve the grant of permission to appear for the necessary -- special tests also. As the matter is not however free from doubt I request the favour of orders of Government permitting the men exempted to appear for the 3 Special tests specified above viz. Revenue Test Lower, Account test Lower and Translation test Lower Grade.

With reference to the Secretary's query at A on the previous page attention is solicited to the notes with G.O. No. 476 Esd., dated 27th June 1894, in which the question was discussed as to whether a special exemption from the Upper Secondary examination should be regarded as carrying with it the right of appearing for all the special tests ^{opened} ~~for~~ ~~which~~ Upper Secondary men. The Honble Mr. Bliss noted, and the Honble Mr. Grose agreed in the view, that exemption from the general educational tests should be regarded as opening the door to the special tests, ~~so~~ so much of G.O. No. 275 Esd., dated 25th April 1893 as related to the prohibition of one Abdul Hai from appearing for the special tests was cancelled. The principle laid down in the notes to the above G.O. was followed in the cases noted below:-
