I am directed to inform you that the India Office has represented to the Government of India that a Government technical scholar from Eastern Bengal and Assam has claimed double second-class fare by railway in India from his place of residence to his port of embarkation and has cited in support of his claim the grant of double second-class fare to Mr. M. N. P. Kurup, a Government technical scholar from the Central Provinces. I am to point out that it was not the intention of the orders contained in the Home Department letter No. 698, dated the 31st August 1907, that more than single second-class railway fare, *plus*, if necessary, the cost of extra freight, etc., should be given in such cases. I am accordingly to request, that if you see no objection, the attention of the Director, Public Instruction, may be drawn to the mistake made by him in granting Mr. Kurup double second-class fare from Vankaner to Bombay.
