Letter—from the Hon'ble Mr. A. G. BOURNE, D.Sc., F.R.S., Director of Public Instruction, Madras.

I have the honour to address Government on the subject of expenditure on sports from public funds in the Reformatory School, Chingleput. G.O., No. 1034, Revenue, dated 10th April 1908, communicated with endorsement No. 1069-1, Educational, dated 13th May 1908, directs that in future no expenditure on sports or games should be incurred from public funds without the previous sanction of Government. The inmates of the Reformatory School, who are juvenile offenders committed for detention in the school, cannot be expected to contribute towards the cost of foot-balls, etc., and towards other expenditure in connection with sports. These charges have, therefore, to be met from public funds. In these circumstances, I have the honour to request that general permission may be accorded to me to sanction from public funds as heretofore such expenditure on sports and games as I consider necessary for the school.

Order—No. 502, Educational, dated 7th July 1908.

The Director of Public Instruction will be informed that G.O., No. 1034, Revenue, dated 10th April 1908, has reference only to the expenditure from public funds on games and sports in the Madras Veterinary College.

2. In the circumstances stated, the Director of Public Instruction will be permitted to sanction from public funds such expenditure on sports and games connected with the Reformatory School as he considers necessary subject to budget provision and to the rules controlling expenditure on petty construction and repairs.
