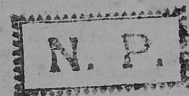

In reference to your Memorandum No. 2296-C., dated 3rd April 1908, communicating G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908, I have the honour to enquire if appointments on Rs. 15 to 20 grade could be filled up by unpassed men.

2. The pay being a progressive one, I presume that under orders contained in G.O., No. 221, Educational dated 15th April 1907, this cannot be done, as salaries of appointments on progressive pay should be calculated at the maximum or average pay of the appointment.

With reference to G.O., No. 226, Educational, of 24th March 1908, communicated with your No. 2296 C. of 3rd instant, I have the honour to enquire whether the quarterly statement of unpassed men temporarily appointed to acting appointments of not more than Rs. 15 per mensem, the submission of which was enjoined in your Memorandum No. 1049-C. of 13th March 1895, is still necessary and whether I am correct in presuming that, under the amended rules, unpassed men can be appointed to Rs. 15—1—20 grade. There being only one graded appointment of V class, I grade (Rs. 15—1—20) below Rs. 20 in the clerical establishment of the department and the financial value of this appointment being $Rs. 15 + \frac{2}{3}$ (Rs. 20—15) = Rupees 18 $\frac{2}{3}$, I am of opinion that there can be no objection to unpassed men being appointed to this grade. Selection will be of course restricted to Matriculates and F.A.'s without Handwriting test in preference to *purely* unpassed men as far as possible, as this will give them time to pass Handwriting and Dictation test and thus qualify themselves for promotion to higher grades before they can draw the maximum pay of the grade, viz., Rs. 20.

G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908, received with your Endorsement No. 2296-C., dated 3rd April 1908, allows the appointment of unpassed men to posts the salary of which is less than Rs. 20.

2. Most of the commencing appointments in this department carry a salary of Rs. 15—1—20 and it is doubtful whether such appointments can be said to be of less than Rs. 20.

3. In the case of the précis-writing test which is a necessary qualification for appointments on Rs. 60 and above, it has been ruled that an appointment the maximum salary of which is Rs. 60 must be held to be one for which the passing of the précis-writing test is necessary. Should the principle of this ruling be applied to the case of appointments on Rs. 15—1—20 it would seem to follow that no unpassed man could be appointed to a clerk's post on Rs. 15—1—20. If this be so, the relaxation allowed in the Educational Department Government Order quoted above would be of no practical help to this department, as the existing difficulty of finding passed men for posts on Rs. 15—1—20 will not be removed, but perpetuated. I have therefore the honour to request that Government may be moved to so modify their order as to exclude appointments on Rs. 15—1—20 from the operation of the Examination rules.

[SUBJECT.—Exemption of appointments on Rs. 15—1—20 from the Examination rules.]

G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908, lays down that none of the educational qualifications prescribed in article 1 of the Public Service Notification is necessary for appointments on a salary of less than Rs. 20 per mensem. The following is an extract of the last note on the subject written in the Educational Department:—

" Rupees 20 was intentionally placed as the limit. It is no hardship to prescribe a general educational test for men drawing Rs. 20. The order will cover all cases of clerks on Rs. 15, Rs. 17½.

It might be desirable to enhance the limit to Rs. 25 in the case of the Ceded Districts, but that is a separate question. Here we deal only with the general question."

2. The Superintending Engineers, II, III and IV Circles, raise the question whether the above order applies to posts on Rs. 15—1—20. The Superintending Engineer, III Circle (Mr. Roscoe Allen), who is in charge of the Ceded districts, states that, if the order does not apply, the relaxation allowed in the Government Order would be of no practical help to this department as the existing difficulty of finding passed men for posts on Rs. 15—1—20 will not be removed but perpetuated. He therefore requests that the appointment may be excluded from the operation of the examination rules. The Superintending Engineer, IV Circle (Mr. O'Connell), points out that there is only one graded appointment of V class first-grade (Rs. 15—1—20) below Rs. 20 in the clerical establishment of the department and that the financial value of this appointment is Rs. 18½. He is therefore of opinion that there can be no objection to unpassed men being appointed to this grade.

3. Existing orders, it is submitted, are against the exclusion of posts on Rupees 15—1—20 from the operation of the examination rules, as, under note (3) at the beginning of the Public Service Notification, these appointments have to be treated as appointments on Rs. 20, which is the maximum pay of the posts.

4. It, therefore, remains to consider whether Educational should be moved to exclude posts on Rs. 15—1—20 from the scope of the examination rules. On this subject, attention is invited to the statement attached, which was prepared in this office, showing the establishment in the Public Works Department on salary ranging between Rs. 15 and Rs. 20, both inclusive. It will be seen that out of 234 appointments

of this class, permanent and temporary, there are as many as 169 on Rs. 15—1—20. The reduction in correspondence which is the object aimed at by the Government

order will not therefore be very considerable in the Public Works Department.

5. In the above circumstances, the case may perhaps be forwarded to Educational for consideration. The case would perhaps be met by the exemption from the rules of the appointment of Rs. 15—1—20, entirely in the case of the Ceded Districts, and partially, up to and including the pay of Rs. 13, in the case of the other districts. EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT.

In G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908, the limit of pay fixed for appointments requiring the educational qualifications prescribed in article 1 of the Public Service Notification was raised from Rs. 15 to Rs. 20.

2. The Public Works Department now point out that out of 234 appointments on salary ranging between Rs. 15 and Rs. 20 in that department, either permanent or temporary, as many as 169 are on the progressive salary of Rs. 15—1—20. As under note (3) to the Public Service Notification "progressive salaries shall be calculated at the maximum pay of the appointment" for purposes of the Public Service Notification, no unpassed man can be appointed to a post on Rs. 15—1—20

by virtue of the orders passed in G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908. The Superintending Engineer, III Circle, states that the relaxation allowed in the Government Order quoted above will be of no practical help to that department as the existing difficulty of finding passed men for posts on Rs. 15—1—20 will not be removed.

3. The Public Works Department accordingly request that all appointments on Rs. 15—1—20 in the Ceded districts, or, as an alternative, "all appointments throughout the service on progressive pay having a maximum of Rs. 20," may be excluded from article 1 of the Public Service Notification as amended by G.O., No. 405, Educational, dated 26th May 1908.

4. It is for consideration whether any and if so which of the suggestions of the Public Works Department may be accepted. Please see Secretary's note on page 11 of the notes connected with G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908, in which he observed that it was no hardship "to prescribe a General Educational Test for men drawing Rs. 20." In the case of appointments to which a progressive salary of Rs. 15—1—20 is attached, the difficulty of getting qualified men for Rs. 15 posts, which it was the object of G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908, to remove, will continue. The Public Works Department appear to have made out a good case for the exemption being extended to posts on Rs. 15—1—20, and it is for consideration whether the exemption may be extended to all posts in public service, or only to such posts in the Public Works Department. Perhaps the other departments of the Secretariat may be first consulted u.o.

P.R.—24-6-08.

K. RANGASWAMI AYYANGAR—24-6-08.

I think the exemption may be extended to all appointments on a progressive salary the maximum of which does not exceed Rs. 20.

H. D. TAYLOR—25-6-08.

I have no objection to this course. It is astonishing that service in the Public Works Department seems so unpopular. In other departments we have not the same objection raised.

M. H[AMMICK]—28-6-08.

All appointments the salary of which is Rs. 20 and below should be exempted from the notification. This was what was intended (see pages 6 and 7 of G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908).

Note 3 of the Public Service Notification must be expunged or amended. I am inclined to think the average value of the appointment should be taken for the purposes of note 3, not the maximum.

G. S[TOKES]—29-6-08.

The Hon'ble Mr. Stokes raises two points—

(i) That posts the pay of which is Rs. 20 or less should be exempted from the General Educational Test instead of posts the salary of which is less than Rs. 20. The Hon'ble Mr. Forbes on page 7 of K.W. G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908, distinctly referred to posts under Rs. 20. For orders as to whether the limit for which no general qualifications are required may be raised so as to include posts on Rs. 20. If there are any general proposals to raise the pay of taluk establishments, I think that posts on Rs. 20 might well be left outside the rule requiring general qualifications.

(ii) As to the suggestion that the average pay instead of the maximum pay should be adopted for the purpose of this rule, I submit that officers with whom appointments rest know at once the pay, or maximum pay of the posts, but do not know at a glance what the average pay is, and even their offices may make miscalculations.

2. With the proposed introduction of the School Final Certificate as a qualifying test, I submit that the *maximum* of Rs. 20 may be adhered to as being a more *definite* figure. There are not, I think, many posts on a progressive scale of, say, Rs. 17½ to 22½ or Rs. 16 to Rs. 21.

H. D. TAYLOR—30-6-08.

It is quite clear from the notes that the intention was to exempt from posts *under* Rs. 20. However, I agree with Mr. Stokes that the exemption may be ~~for~~ Rs. 20 and under.

A | I would retain the maximum pay of progressive appointments as the standard.

The Hon'ble Mr. Stokes will probably not object to this.

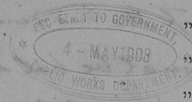
