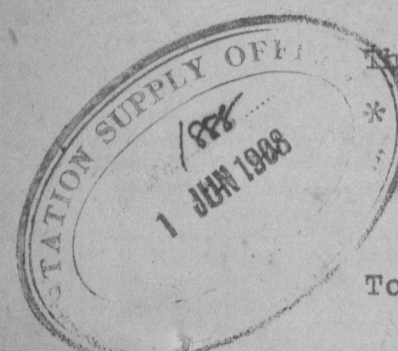

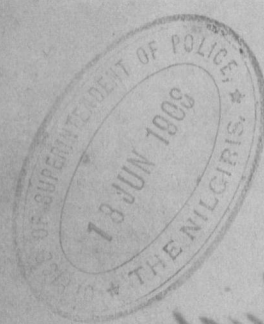
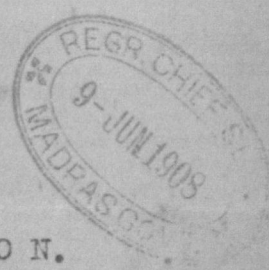

I beg permission to intrude upon your valuable time

2. The question of handing over the hospital stores

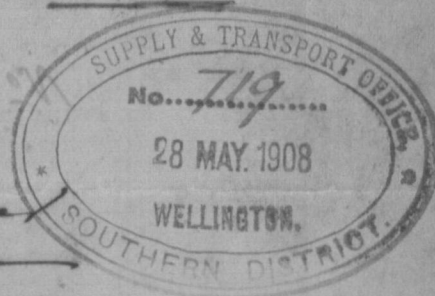
7. For which act of kindness and charity, I shall, as in duty bound, ever be grateful.

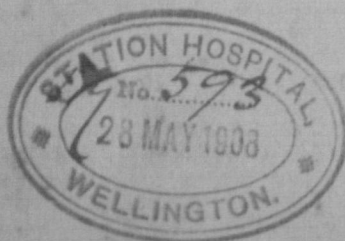

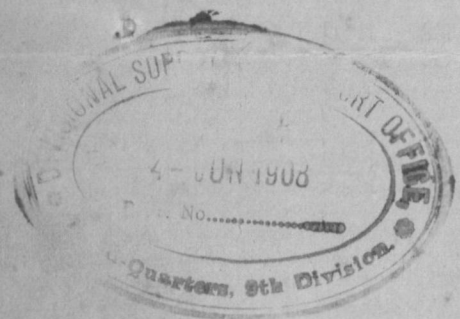

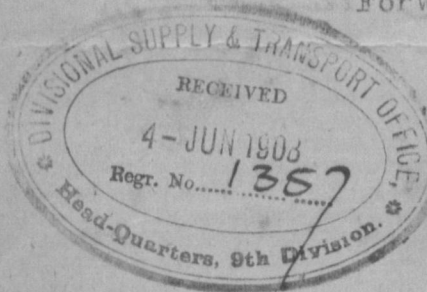
