Memorandum No. 748-1, Educational, dated 26th March 1908.

The Anjuman-e-Munirul Islam of Mangalore has requested that a Government Muhammadan Girls' school may be established at Mangalore.

The Director of Public Instruction is requested to report whether any real demand exists for the establishment by Government of a Muhammadan Girls' school in the town of Mangalore or elsewhere in the South Canara district. If he considers that a school should be established, he is requested to state whether it should be of the elementary or of the secondary grade, what scale of establishment he proposes for the school when started, and how he would propose to house it.

Letter—from the Hon'ble Mr. A. G. BOURNE, D.Sc., F.R.S., Director of Public Instruction.

With reference to memorandum No. 748-1, dated 26th March 1908, asking me to report whether there exists any real demand for the establishment by Government of a Muhammadan Girls' school in the town of Mangalore or in the South Canara district, I have the honour to state that a real demand has been ascertained to exist for the establishment of such a school in Mangalore. The inspecting officers seem to have urged on the Municipal Council during the past two years the necessity for opening such a school, but the proposal, it is reported, has not met with a ready response owing to the exiguity of the Council's finances. The number of Muhammadan girls in the town who would attend the school is estimated by the Inspectress to be 150, and it is expected that the attendance would be at least 40 at the outset and that it would soon increase to 60. I have the honour, therefore, to recommend that a Muhammadan Girls' school of the elementary grade be opened at Mangalore under departmental management and that a staff of two teachers be appointed for the present on the scale fixed for Muhammadan Girls' schools in G.O., No. 515, Educational, dated 8th August 1907, viz., Rs. 15 and Rs. 12. The establishment and other charges will be as follows:—

One teacher on	Rs. 15 per mensem.
One teacher on	12 "
Conductress Rs. 2 plus an estimated capitation allowance of Rs. 3 or	5 in all per mensem.
Sweeper	1 per mensem.
Contingencies	3 "
Library and prizes	2 "
Rent	10 "
Total	48

The total charges are expected to amount to Rs. 48 per mensem or Rs. 576 a year, and a further sum of Rs. 30 per mensem is likely to be required for conveyance to bring the Gosha girls to school.

The school may begin work in January next, in which case the charge for the current year will be about Rs. 100 which can be met by re-appropriation from the budget.

2. I submit herewith the necessary proposition and re-appropriation statements, in duplicate, for sanction.

Establishment by Government of a Muhammadan Girls' School.

Deputation of the Anjuman-e-Munirul Islam, Mangalore.
Argument.

That education of children is particularly due to the care and attention of their mothers. The Muhammadan females of this district are mostly ignorant for want of proper education. Therefore if a Government girls' school be established here, the future condition of their females will be improved and as a consequence the education of the Muhammadan children will also improve.

Collector's Note.

A Government Muhammadan girls' school is much needed at Mangalore, and the request for it deserves the favourable consideration of the Educational authorities.

Secretariat Note.

EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT.

There is at present no Government Muhammadan girls' school in the South Canara district, nor is there any industrial school; but elementary education of girls is now a matter which falls strictly within the province of Local funds. Nor, if an industrial school is started under the auspices either of the Municipal Council or of Government, would there appear to be sufficient reason to restrict admission thereto to Muhammadan boys. It does not appear that the memorialists have as yet addressed the Municipal Council on the subject.

As to the Muhammadan girls' school, female elementary education is now a charge upon *Local* (including Municipal) and not upon Provincial funds though the Government continue to maintain the girls' schools—both Hindu and Muhammadan—which were in existence prior to the introduction of the revised Grant-in-Aid Code. The Municipality does not at present appear to maintain a Muhammadan girls' school and its present financial condition owing to plague is not such as to make it likely that it can meet the extra expenditure involved.

The question whether a Government Muhammadan girls' school may be opened at Mangalore may be referred to the Director of Public Instruction for consideration. The nearest Government Muhammadan girls' school is in Coimbatore (G.O., No. 515, Educational, dated 8th August 1907).

General.

The requests of the deputations of the Azizia Muslim Educational Association, Kasaragod, and of the Anjuman-e-Munirul Islam, Mangalore, are too special and restricted to the South Canara district. No reason has been adduced why Muhammadans of *South Canara* should be singled out for special treatment. They are not shown to be worse off than their compatriots elsewhere. Inquiries may be made into the question of establishing a Muhammadan girls' school at Mangalore.

[Memorandum No. 748-1, Educational, dated 26th March 1908.]

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 13th June 1908, No. 2370.

The Director of Public Instruction reports that there is a real demand for the establishment of a school for Muhammadan girls in Mangalore and that the Municipal Council which was requested by the Inspecting officers to open such a school during the last two years has not seen its way to do so owing to the exiguity of its finances. The Director therefore recommends the establishment of an elementary school under Government management with the following staff:—

One teacher on Rs. 15 per mensem.

One teacher on Rs. 12 per mensem.

One conductress on Rs. 2 per mensem

plus capitation allowance.

One sweeper on Re. 1 per mensem.

These should be charged to contingencies.

He estimates that the charges on account of rent, contingencies and library and prizes will amount to Rs. 15 per mensem and that a further sum of Rs. 30 per mensem is likely to be required for conveyance to bring the Gosha girls to school.

2. The Director recommends that the school be opened from January next and states that the cost of the school during the current official year, which will be about Rs. 100, can be met by reappropriation from the budget.

3. The proposal of the Director of Public Instruction may, it is submitted, be approved with the concurrence of the Financial Department.

4. The draft placed below is for approval.

In the civil budget estimate for 1908-1909, provision is made for seven carts on account of the Hobart Muhammadan Training school, Madras. The total amount provided for this purpose is Re. 1,260, at the rate of Rs. 15 per cart per mensem. At this rate, the sum of Rs. 30 per mensem, which the Director of Public Instruction estimates as likely to be required for conveyances, will be enough for carts. Perhaps in Mangalore it may be possible to get carts at a cheaper rate than in Madras.
