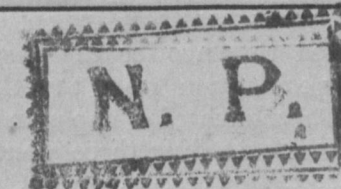

I have the honour to state that I propose empowering Deputy Inspectors-General to grant leave to Inspectors in their ranges and to arrange for the acting appointments (provided that all acting appointments in vacancies of over three months' duration are submitted to me for approval) in the leave vacancies. I find, however, that the power of exempting unpassed men to fill temporary vacancies has been vested in the Inspector-General alone under G.O., No. 394, Educational, dated 10th May 1895. The appointments to be made are merely the selection of the most suitable sub-inspectors or head constables to act for the Inspectors granted leave. I therefore request that the power of granting temporary exemptions for a period not exceeding three months from the Criminal Judicial test, Lower grade, and the Précis-writing test in all cases where it is found necessary to appoint unpassed men to act as Inspectors of Police may be delegated to Deputy Inspectors-General of Police.

[SUBJECT.—*Exemption from Examination Rules—Delegation of powers.*]

JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

From the Inspector-General of Police, dated 29th June 1908, No. 844.

Under section 10 of the Madras District Police Act, 1859, Deputy Inspectors-General of Police have no powers of appointment. In practice, however, they do make certain appointments. To give this practice legal force, it is now proposed to include Deputy Inspectors-General in section 10. The papers on the subject are now with Legislative. Perhaps it is unnecessary to say anything about the proposal. If Deputy Inspectors-General appoint, they should grant leave.
