requires that two members of the college professorial staff should be advisory members of the Board of Examiners, and, accordingly, Mr. James, late Professor of Mechanical Engineering and M. R. Ry B. Hanumanta Rau, Professor of Mathematics, were appointed as advisory members for the Examinations of 1907-1908. The Principal now states that neither Professor of Engineering is at present familiar with the work done in the other branch and suggests that for the ensuing December and April examinations the number of advisory members should be raised from two to three. I agree with the Principal and, accordingly, recommend that sanction be accorded to the appointment of three advisory members to the Board, viz., the Professors of Civil and Mechanical Engineering and the Professor of Mathematics, as it is

Under rule 70 of the rules for the working of the College of Engineering, the Board of Examiners of the College consists of a President and two members appointed by Govt.; with two members of the College professional staff as Advisory members.

2. Including the Principal, the professorial staff of the College consists of one Professor of Civil Engineering, one Professor of Mechanical Engineering and one Professor of Mathematics. During the year 1907-08 Mr. James, late Professor of Mechanical Engineering, and Mr. Hanumanta Rao, Professor of Mathematics, were appointed Advisory members.

But at present both the Professors of Engineering are new men and ^{neither} ~~neither~~ of them is, the D.P.I., states, familiar with the work done by the other. The Director therefore proposes that both the Professors of Eng. and the Professor of Mathematics, making in all three, may be appointed as Advisory members ~~during~~ for the ensuing December and April examinations.
