Letter—from the Hon'ble Mr. A. G. BOURNE, D.Sc., F.R.S., C.I.E., Director of Public Instruction, Madras.

I have the honour to report that, on the 29th June last, the date on which the Law College reopened after the summer vacation, Mr. C. E. Odgers, Junior Professor, who was permitted in G.O., Mis. No. 158, Educational, dated 4th March 1908, to proceed to Europe during the vacation, was not able to be present at the College as the mail steamer by which he was returning was delayed by an accident and he could arrive in Madras only on the morning of the succeeding day. As under G.O., No. 710, Educational, dated 19th October 1907, I am not competent to grant him casual leave for the day of his absence, I beg to recommend that, as a special case, his absence be treated as casual leave. A similar course was adopted in G.O., No. 168, Educational, dated 9th March 1908, in the case of some of the assistants of the Rajahmundry Arts and Training Colleges.

2. Owing to Mr. Odgers' absence on the 29th June last, Dr. Swaminathan who had been appointed to act as Junior Professor was able to take formal charge of his appointment only the next day; but it is reported that he was present at the College on the reopening day and actually did some lecturing work on that date. I beg, therefore, to recommend that he be considered as having taken charge of his appointment on the 29th June.

Order—No. 602, Educational, dated 24th August 1908.

In the special circumstances represented by the Director of Public Instruction, the absence of Mr. C. E. Odgers on the 29th June 1908, will be treated as casual leave; but with reference to the note to article 332 of the Civil Service Regulations, he cannot be considered to have taken charge of the office of the Principal on the 29th June. Mr. Odgers should accordingly be regarded as having taken charge of the Principalship on the 30th June and Dr. Swaminathan, who was present at the College on the 29th June 1908 and actually did some lecturing work, will be considered as having acted as Principal of the Law College on that day.

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 6th August 1908, No. 4544.

The Law College, Madras, reopened, after the summer vacation, on the 29th June 1908. Mr. Odgers, who had been permitted to proceed to Europe during the vacation, ought to have been present on the re-opening day; but he was delayed on his way owing to an accident which happened to the steamer by which he travelled and was able to reach Madras only on the succeeding day—the 30th June 1908. In view of these circumstances, the Director of Public Instruction requests with reference to G.O., No. 710, Educational, dated 19th October 1907, that Mr. Odgers may be granted casual leave for the 29th June, on which date he was absent, and that Dr. Swaminathan who was appointed to act as Junior Professor from the date of the re-opening of the College, and who actually attended and lectured to the students on the 29th June, may be considered as having taken charge of his appointment on that day.

2. A draft order sanctioning the Director's requests is submitted for approval.

There appears to be no objection to treat Mr. Odgers as having been on casual leave on the 29th June 1908 (as in the case disposed of in G.O., No. 168, Educational, dated 9th March 1908), but the question seems to arise whether he should be regarded as having assumed charge of the acting appointment of Principal on the 29th or as continuing in his permanent appointment of Junior Professor on that date. In the latter case, Dr. Swaminathan cannot be considered to have assumed charge of the Junior Professorship on the 29th June, as both of them cannot claim pay for that day as Junior Professor. Perhaps the Accountant-General may be asked u.o. to state whether the Director of Public Instruction's proposal in this respect may be accepted.

ACCOUNTANT-GENERAL'S OFFICE.

The grant of casual leave is subject to the condition that the rules regarding taking charge of an office are not thereby evaded (see note under article 332, Civil Service Regulations). There is no objection to the grant of casual leave to Mr. Odgers for the 29th June, but he can only be considered to have taken charge of the office of Principal on the 30th June. On the 29th he can only be considered to have been Junior Professor. Dr. Swaminathan cannot be considered to have taken charge of the office of Junior Professor till the 30th. It is open to Government to appoint him Acting Principal for the 29th.

The Accountant-General is, I think, correct.

In the circumstances, Dr. Swaminathan may be considered as having acted as Principal of the Law College on June 29th.

Mr. Odgers' absence on 29th may be considered as casual leave in his capacity of Junior Professor, and he may be regarded as having assumed charge of the office of Principal on 30th idem.
