With reference to memorandum No. 423-1, Educational, dated 22nd February 1908, I have the honour to state that 31 teachers in the Government elementary schools in the Ganjám Agency and two teachers in the Government girls' school, Rajahmundry, receive at present less than Rs. 8 per mensem and that all the teachers in the schools in the Agency tracts of Ganjám, Vizagapatam and Bhadrachalam and in the girls' school referred to above also receive in addition to their pay results stipends. In view to the discontinuance of the system of paying results stipends to these schools, I have been in correspondence with the inspecting officers regarding the revision of the scales of salaries in them so as to compensate for the loss of stipends which, merely raising the salaries to Rs. 8, will not do. I shall make the necessary proposals as soon as they have been matured. If, irrespective of these proposals, the pay of these 33 teachers be raised to Rs. 8 per mensem, with retrospective effect from 1st April 1908, it will be a step in the right direction, and this increase will be taken into account when submitting further proposals.

2. It might, however, save trouble to defer the case of the Agency teachers until it can be finally dealt with.

3. I submit two proposition statements—one on behalf of the Agency schools in Ganjam and the other for the Government girls' school at Rajahmundry—proposing the conversion of appointments on Rs. 5 and 6 to Rs. 8 for such orders as Government may pass and, if they are sanctioned, I shall submit the necessary reappropriation statement.

IV. Elementary teachers—

The Raja of Kollengode suggests—

(1) that the lowest pay of a teacher in Elementary schools should be Rs. 8.

Office-note.

Under rule 82 of the new Educational rules the lowest pay of a teacher in an Elementary school under public management is Rs. 8 per mensem. If the Honourable Raja means by his suggestion that the lowest pay of such teachers even in aided schools should be Rs. 8 per mensem, this is not a matter in which Government can interfere except by imposing this as a condition of aid.

The Educational Department propose a lump provision of .01 lakh to be made in the budget estimate for 1908-1909 under the head 22. EDUCATION for raising to Rs. 8 per mensem the lowest pay of teachers in Government Elementary schools. The total budget estimate for 1908-1909 under the Major head 22. EDUCATION is 37.60 lakhs. In their first edition of budget notes the Government of India have made a lump deduction of 1.10 lakhs, but they have retained the figure 37.60 lakhs which may be distributed under the several minor heads and sub-heads. In view of this fact it is submitted that there is no need to make a provision of .01 lakh in next year's budget. If the proposal to raise the minimum pay is sanctioned there will be A | no difficulty in providing funds by re-appropriation under the same major head.

It is not clear why we should assume A. The Educational budget has been fixed at what this Government consider necessary and it does not follow that because India play for a round figure of 36.50 lakhs, we can find .01 lakh if it is required. If the provision is to be orked in we w can ask Accountant-General to arrange for an addition of .01 lakh to the estimate already accepted by Government and if India still desire to keep the figure at 36.50, they can subtract 1.11. For our purposes India's lump deduction which will not affect the provisions under minor heads might be anything at all. Government have not consulted the Director of Public Instruction, but there seems to be no doubt as to the soundness of the proposal.

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 28th July 1908, R. C. No. 1559.

In Memorandum No. 423-1, dated 22nd February 1908, the Director of Public Instruction was requested to submit proposals for increasing the minimum pay of teachers in Government elementary boys' and girls' schools to Rs. 8 each per mensem with effect from 1st April 1908. This was with reference to a suggestion made by the Honourable the Raja of Kollengode at the Budget Conference held on 1st February last, that the lowest pay of a teacher in elementary schools should be Rs. 8—*vide* paragraph 20 of the notes of the Budget Conference on page 76 of the collection put up.

2. The Director of Public Instruction now submits two proposition statements—

one for * increasing to Rs. 8 per mensem the pay of 30 teachers on Rs. 5 each and of one teacher on Rs. 6 employed in the Government elementary schools for boys in the Ganjam Agency, and the other

for raising from Rs. 6— $\frac{1}{4}$ —8 to Rs. 8 (fixed) each per mensem of two of the teachers employed in the Government girls' school, Rajahmundry. Dr. Bourne observes that all the teachers in the Agency tracts of Ganjam, Vizagapatam and Bhadrachalam

Paragraph 1 of his letter.

and in the girls' school referred to above now receive results stipends in addition to pay, that he has in contemplation proposals for revising the scales of salaries in them so as to compensate the teachers for the loss of results stipends, the

payment of which should be abolished under the New Educational Rules,† and that he would submit the proposals as soon as they have been matured. In the meantime, he recommends that the pay

of the 33 teachers referred to may be raised to Rs. 8 each per mensem with retrospective effect from 1st April 1908 and states that this increase which is not an adequate compensation for the loss of results stipends will be taken into consideration when submitting the further proposals.

Paragraph 2 of Director of Public Instruction's letter.

He, however, suggests that it might save trouble to defer the case of the Agency teachers until it can be finally dealt with.

3. It is for consideration whether the proposals now submitted may not be sanctioned as a first instalment of the proposed general revision of the scales of salaries of the teachers in the schools referred to, or whether the increase in the case of Agency schools may be deferred for the present as suggested by the Director of Public Instruction, the increase of pay proposed for the two teachers of the Rajahmundry girls' school being alone sanctioned. In view of the fact that the scales of salaries of the teachers in the elementary schools managed by Local Boards and Municipal Councils throughout the Presidency have already been revised so as to raise the minimum salary of a teacher to Rs. 8 per mensem with reference to rule 82 of the Educational Rules (Fifth edition), it appears to be desirable not to postpone the present proposals.

4. The extra cost which the proposals will involve, if sanctioned with effect from 1st April 1908, is Rs. 1,028 $\frac{1}{5}$. A lump provision of Rs. 1,000 has been made on this account in the Civil Budget Estimate for the current year—*vide* page 138.
