I have the honour to forward
herewith a memorial to His Excellency the
Governor in Council, submitted by the Assis-
tant Writer of the Government Museum,
together with a copy of his covering letter to
myself.

2. There are, on the Museum staff,
two Writers, whose pay and service are as follows:-

3. I may add that, during his service, the Memorialist has carried out his duties to my entire satisfaction. He writes a very good hand, and has always been punctual, regular, and diligent in the conduct of his work. The chances of promotion in this Office are, as he states, very remote, and I shall be glad to see his financial position improved.

Sir,

I beg to submit the accompanying Memorial to Govt. with a request that you will forward the same with your recommendations.

2. The starting pay and consequently the condition and status of low paid clerks, in some of the Offices in this Presidency town, viz, the Office of the Dir. of Pub. Instruction and the High Court, evoked the pity and sympathy of their Heads of Depts, and the clerks were recommended by them for higher pay viz Rs. 30 to start with. The clerks in the Office of the Comptroller Archt. to Govt. were recommended for higher pay and the starting pay was accordingly made Rs 20-2-30. As the Office Estt. of Govt. Museum consists of limited number of clerks, my case is far more deplorable than the cases of last clerks in the above said as well as in all other Offices, where they have chances of promotion, in the ordinary

course, at least, to Rs. 30/- during a period of nine years' service. In this connection, I beg to state that within a period of 3 years i.e. Sept. 1895 to Sept. 1898, some 4 or 5 persons held the post of Asst. Writer and they left it after short periods of service to seek employment elsewhere and after 3 months I was appointed in Decr. 1898.

3. In conclusion I beg to state that I submit this memorial with the full belief that I deserve sympathy and kindness at your hands and that on your strong recommendations alone, I shall be fortunate enough to gain the boon prayed for.

4. For which act of kindness, I shall as in duty bound, ever pray.

Most Respectfully Showeth,

That your Memorialist is the last clerk in the Office of the Government Museum, Madras, drawing a pay of Rs. 16½ per mensem with 9 years service to his credit. He has passed the Matriculation Examination in 1896 and the Handwriting and Dictation Test in 1897.

2. That your Memorialist joined this office on Rs. 15, some 9 years ago, and, he believes that there is hardly any clerk in any of the Public Offices

in this Presidency town, who has been so unfortunate as to get an increase of only one rupee and eight annas during a period of 9 years spotless service.

3. That the chances of promotion in this office are either little or very remote owing to its limited establishment of only four persons in the superior grades of service.

4. That your Memorialist has with numerous others felt in recent years that living in the Presidency town has become more and more costly, the chief causes being the ever increasing prices of the food-stuffs and other bare necessities of existence and the heavy house rent, which in the town of Madras has always been on the increase.

5. That your Memorialist finds it a difficult task to eke out a living in these hard days with his low salary of Rs. 16½, which is barely sufficient to provide the principal item of food, to wit, rice for even a moderate family.

6. That your Memorialist therefore prays, that in view of these circumstances and of the fact that the

starting

starting pay of clerks was fixed years ago, when living was much cheaper than at present, his starting pay may be fixed at Rs. 30/- per mensem and he be given the advantage of it from the date of Government Order.

7. For this act of Your Excellency's kindness and generosity in the matter, your Memorialist shall as in duty bound ever pray,
