Sir,

I have the honour to request that the sanction
of Government may be accorded as a special case to an expenditure
of Rs. 70/- for repairing the two tennis courts of the Presidency
Training School for Mistresses, Madras. The Inspectress of Girls'
Schools, Central Circle, has also requested sanction for the
purchase of a tennis net at a cost of Rs. 12-4-0, but I shall
inform her that the charge should be met from the subscriptions
of the tennis club of the school and not from public funds.

2. The expenditure (Rs. 70/-) can be met from the
allotment for 'Petty Works of Construction for Training Schools
for Mistresses' in the current year's budget.

The D.P.I. requests the sanction of Government to an expenditure of ₹70 for repairing two tennis courts attached to the Presidency Training School for Mistresses, Madras.

2. Under G.O.No.716, Edl., dated 28th October 1907, expenditure on cricket pitches and tennis courts attached to colleges should be met from the subscriptions of the cricket and tennis clubs of the colleges and not from public funds; ^{it was laid down that} and no expenditure on such objects should be incurred without the previous sanction of Government.

3. ~~But~~ In connection with this question, the Hon'ble Member noted--

"It may be that in primary or infant schools or in poor schools expenditure on some sorts of games may be justifiable, but in secondary schools and above I should say it was illegitimate to spend money out of the rates in laying down a cricket pitch or laying out a tennis court." - vide page 2 of

k.w. G.O.No.716, Edl., dated 25th October 1907.

4. The Presidency Training School for Mistresses is a ^{training} ~~girls~~ school ^{for girls} and all the students undergoing training in it are in

receipt

receipt of stipends from Government. Most of these students presumably have no other means of support. Please see para.3 of the D.P.I's note dated 24th June 1908 on page 6 of k.w. X G.O.No.513, Edl., dated 10th July 1908. In view of these circumstances it seems undesirable to make these girls under training pay the cost of repairing the tennis court attached to the Presidency Training School for Mistresses.

In his note dated 25th September 1907, the Hon. said,

"In Colleges the expenditure on Cricket pitches and tennis Courts should be met from the subscriptions of the Cricket and tennis Club of the College and not from public funds."

2. The above remarks of the Hon. on which go. no. 716 Edl. dated 28th October 1907 was based, seem to have reference only to Colleges.

3. In go. no. 502 Edl., dated 7th July 1908, the Govt. permitted the D.P.I. to sanction from public funds ^{Such} expenditure on Sports and games, as he considered necessary connected with the Reformatory School subject to budget provision and to the rules controlling expenditure on petty construction and repairs.
