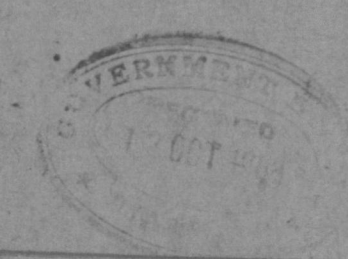

ABSTRACT.—Sanctioning, subject to certain conditions, a grant of Rs. 3,200 towards the cost of the improvements and extension of the hostels for Indian and European students attached to the Young Women's Christian Association, Madras.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your favour of the 18th instant, No. 5133 of 1907, and to thank you, in the name of our General Committee, for the substantial assistance promised.

We are prepared to comply with the conditions laid down for a one-third grant. The slight alterations in the plans requested by the Chief Engineer will be made and the plans returned at once.

In view of the urgency of these additional rooms and the imminence of the monsoon, we would be greatly obliged if you would kindly give us permission to proceed with the work at once, as it will in no way interfere with any alterations which may be required by the Chief Engineer.

Submitted to Government, Educational Department, with reference to G.O., No. 577, Educational, dated 5th August 1908, and recommended that the General Secretary's request that she may be allowed to begin the work of extending and improving the European and Indian hostels may be granted as a special case in view of the circumstances explained by her.

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 24th August 1908, No. 5133.

Please see the notes and orders with G.O., No. 577, Educational, dated 5th August 1908. In that order, the Government stated that they would be prepared to sanction under article 51 of the Grant-in-Aid Code a grant not exceeding Rs. 3,200 or one-third of the cost of the improvement and extension of the hostels for Indian and European students attached to the Young Women's Christian Association, Madras, whichever was less, subject to the condition, among others, that the estimates for the work were revised in accordance with the Chief Engineer's note of the 18th July 1908 and that the estimates, when revised, were submitted to Government for further scrutiny.

2. The General Secretary of the Association states that the Association are prepared to comply with the conditions laid down for a one-third grant and that the slight alterations in the plans requested by the Chief Engineer will be made and the plans returned at once. The Secretary however requests that "in view of the urgency of the additional rooms and the imminence of the monsoon", the Association may be permitted to proceed with the work, in the meantime, as it will in no way interfere with any alterations which may be required by the Chief Engineer.

3. The Director of Public Instruction recommends that in view of the circumstances explained by the Secretary of the Association, the permission applied for may be granted. A similar concession was allowed in the case of the Mylapore Girls' school and the Tirukkattupalle High school—*vide* Memorandum No. 48-1, dated 1st January 1908, on page 3 of G.O., No. 136, Educational, dated 24th February 1908, and Memorandum No. 2954-1, dated 24th December 1897, on page 2 of G.O., No. 205, Educational, dated 18th March 1908. For cases in which the concession was asked for, but was disallowed, please see G.O., No. 66, Educational, dated 25th January 1908, and Memorandum No. 262-1, dated 20th February 1908, on page 2 of G.O., No. 209, Educational, dated 19th March 1908.

4. In view however of the fact that the plans and estimates have been submitted by the Association and examined by the Chief Engineer and that this officer has called for some further information only to complete the scrutiny, it is for consideration whether the Director of Public Instruction's recommendation may be accepted and permission granted to the Association to commence the work at once.
