The question was considered. The orders were that the full allowance as paid to Mr. Scott should be paid to Mr. Maddox.

H. D. TAYLOR—12-8-08.

Please see the notes on pages 8 and 9 of G.O., No. 315 R., dated 28th July 1908, in which it was decided that Mr. Maddox should receive the allowance attached to the post of Secretary to the Commissioner for Government Examinations, namely, Rs. 350 *per mensem*, without any reduction. The Accountant-General may, if it is submitted, be informed accordingly.

Mr. Maddox is a retired employee of the Lawrence Asylum, Ootacamund, and not a Government servant in the present employment of Government as previous Secretaries to the Commissioner for Government Examinations have been. The term "Local" allowance seems therefore to be inappropriate. The allowance may be styled "allowance" only.

Presumably there is no objection to Mr. Maddox being allowed to draw this allowance; but as he is a European appointed in India and the amount of allowance exceeds Rs. 200, the sanction of the Government of India to the appointment may be necessary. The Accountant-General has not raised this objection.
