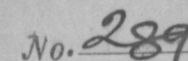

The humble petitioner of
C. A. Ghulam Mustaglis.

Most humbly Sheweth,

That your Excellency's humble memorialist with every mark of respect begs to lay before your Excellency his modest request with the confident hope that it will meet at your Excellency's hands the favourable consideration it deserves.

That your Excellency's humble memorialist's father A. Chanda mesh Sahab presented a petition to your Excellency in Council on behalf of the memorialist on 15th March 1907, praying that his Son (the memorialist) may be exempted from passing the examination rules with a view to qualify him for the public service. In reply the petition was communicated with an order by the Government the copy of which is now unfortunately missing and the original is recorded in the Deputy Commissioner's office of the Central Division.

That in due obedience to the said Government order the memorialist's father followed by the petitioner had the honour of having a personal interview with the late Deputy Commissioner.

No such paper
can be traced
in the office.

1. H. F. M. Tyler Esquire Esq. and an representing
to him the full facts of his most deplorable
case, the Officer was kind enough to admit the
petitioner's father's request and also communi-
cated the enclosed reply marked Encl. I to the
petitioner's father.

That with reference to the Deputy
Commissioner's Memorandum No. 1341 of 0797
7th June 1907, the Assistant Commissioner of
Bres. Sub Division has appointed him as
the 26th June 1907, as an a.g. Salt Sub Inspector
on Rs 15/- p.m. in the Bres. Sub Division vide
appointment order marked Enclosures 2, 3, 4.
annexed herein for your Excellency's perusal.
The petitioner joined duties on 7-7-07
& since then up to the end of May 1908, he
served as an a.g. Sub Inspector on Rs 15/- alone
in several Ranges of that Sub Division. The
petitioner's acting period ceased on 7-5-08.

That the petitioner on hearing that
there were permanent vacancies of Salt Sub
Inspectors in Bellary Sub Division, applied
to the Assistant Commissioner Bellary to confer
upon him a Sub Inspector's place on Rs 25/- p.m.
if there was any vacancy in his Sub Division.
The Officer in reply communicated the petitioner
the enclosed endorsement marked Enclosure 5.

That in connection with the
Contents of Enclosure 5, the petitioner begs
to state that if he had been already
excepted by the Government from passing
the

the examination rules, there would be no
not the least objection for the petitioner
entertainment in the Salt Dept. as a Sub-
Inspector on Rs 25/- p.m. to start with,
which is an ordinary pay for an outsider
when given a direct chance of a Sub Inspector.

That the petitioner considering
that it is hardly necessary for him to persua-
date upon the details of his family connection
etc, begs that a reference be made to the
original petition of 15th March 1907 submitted
to your Excellency in Council by his father
N. Chandanab Sahab in which the full
details are given. The petitioner once more
begs to state that he belongs to such a
respectable family among the Mohanwade
Community the members of which were highly
esteemed by the Maharaja of Carnatic & were
being the leading citizens of Mysore &
for which Mysore were granted to his elders
& as such he is descended from the Maudan
family of Bres.

That the petitioner has recently
seen in the Fort Saint George Gazette of 8th
September 1908 that the Secretary of Board
& Revenue (Land Revenue) has invited Candidates
for the posts of Rangers of several grades
and the Assistant Commissioners of Salt, Saltan
& Customs Dept. the whole Salt & on invited Can-
didates for Sub Inspector appointments in Vijay-
Nagar and Gangan Dto, but at the same
time ^{require} spaces or excepted Candidates. Among
both the invitations of the respective Officers

for Salt duty to great extent, already
having gained the experience of the executive work
of that dept.

That the petitioner is a young man
of below 23 years old, well educated in English,
Persian, Urdu, Tamil & Telugu to a certain extent
and well built by physical qualifications
can stand any amount of exertion in the execu-
tive duty.

That therefore the petitioner
begs to throw himself upon the clemency of the
crown and prays that your Excellency will be
graciously pleased to deem him at least
deserving for the Salt Department and then
grant him a permanent exemption from
passing the examination rules so as to qualify
himself for a permanent Salt Sub Inspector
post and graciously the petitioner will then perform
the required departmental examinations
for further promotion. The petitioner prays
that in these hard days of scarcity and starvation
he may not be shuffled out from your
Excellency's exalted doors where he has come
at last to seek relief having been shuffled out
from door to door. Your Excellency will then leave
behind a monument of your Excellency's gener-
osity in him after your Excellency's departure from
these our peaceful shores after a well-earned leave.

For which act of grace, the petitioner
and the existing members of his family are in duty
bound, will ever pray for your Excellency's long life
health, wealth & prosperity
