Informing the Director of Public Instruction that the Government of India have sanctioned the grant of — to officers in the Indian Educational Service in the Madras Presidency at the rate of Rs. 5 per diem with effect from the 19th March 1908.

The Government of India have had under consideration for some time past the question of the rate of daily allowance admissible to officers of the Indian Educational Service under entry No. 93, appendix 25 of the Civil Service Regulations, and they have lately sanctioned a proposal put forward by the Governments of Bengal and Bombay that officers of the Indian Educational Service in those presidencies should be permitted to draw a daily allowance of Rs. 5, which is admissible generally under the provision of article 1063 of the Civil Service Regulations to all officers of the first class. They have now decided that the concession granted to officers of the Indian Educational Service in Bengal and Bombay should be extended simultaneously to all such officers in other provinces. Entry No. 93 in appendix 25 of the Civil Service Regulations will be modified accordingly; and in the meantime officers of the Indian Educational Service in Madras should be permitted to draw a daily allowance of Rs. 5 under the provisions of article 1063, with effect from the 19th March 1908.

2. I am to add that the Government of India were unable to accept a proposal which was put forward at the same time that the higher rate of allowance should be extended to officers of the Provincial Educational Service whose pay exceeds Rs. 500 a month, as in their opinion the grant of the higher rate to members of that Service would have led to demands from other provincial services for which a daily allowance of Rs. 4 has hitherto been considered sufficient.

The Director of Public Instruction will be informed that the Government of India have sanctioned the grant of daily allowance to officers of the Indian Educational Service in the Madras Presidency at the rate of Rs. 5 per diem, being the rate admissible generally under the provisions of article 1063 of the Civil Service Regulations to all officers of the first class, and have directed that pending the modification of entry No. 93 in appendix 25 of the Civil Service Regulations, officers of the Indian Educational Service in the Madras Presidency should be permitted to draw a daily allowance of Rs. 5 under the provisions of article 1063, with effect from the 19th March 1908.

2. The Director of Public Instruction will be informed that the Government of India have declined to extend the grant of this concession to officers of the Provincial Educational Service whose pay exceeds Rs. 500 a month.
