ABSTRACT.—Requesting the Director of Public Instruction to inform M.R.Ry. Rao Sahib S. Krishnamachariar that the Government have accepted his offer to endow a gold medal in the name of Mr. G. S. T. Harris in connection with the College of Engineering, Madras; and also to obtain two formal applications under the Charitable Endowments Act.

Referring to paragraph 2 of G.O., No. 768, Educational, dated 18th November 1907, I have the honour to submit herewith two formal applications from M.R.Ry. Rao Sahib S. Krishnamachariar under the Charitable Endowments Act, one for vesting the "Harris Gold Medal endowment" in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments and the other for settling a scheme for the administration of the property.

2. Two separate draft notifications on the subject prepared by the Government Solicitor are also submitted, in duplicate, for the approval of Government and publication in the *Fort St. George Gazette*.

3. A Government promissory note for Rs. 1,000—the value of the endowment fund—which was received from the donor was sent to the Accountant-General on the 15th ultimo for safe custody.

With reference to Proceedings of the Director of Public Instruction, No. 3154, dated 28th November 1907, I beg to enclose 3½ Government promissory note of 1900 for Rs. 1,000 and beg to apply that the same may be vested in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments towards an annual medal from its interest for a student in the College of Engineering, Madras, to be called the G. S. T. Harris medal and request you will be good enough to obtain the sanction of Government for vesting the same in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments.

With reference to the Proceedings of the Director of Public Instruction, No. 3154, dated 28th November 1907, I beg to forward herewith an application for endowment of the G. S. T. Harris medal and a scheme for administering the same and I apply that you will be good enough to obtain the sanction of Government for the settlement of the same.

SCHEME FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE G. S. T. HARRIS MEDAL.

The Principal of the College of Engineering for the time being and the Chief Engineer, Public Works Department (General Branch), for the time being shall be the joint administrators of the fund for G. S. T. Harris medal vested in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments.

2. The medal will be awarded annually to the first student in the Engineer class of the College in (1) Architecture or (2) Electrical Engineering or (3) other subject as may be determined from time to time by the said administrators.

3. The die prepared for the purpose by Messrs. P. Orr & Sons and paid for by the donor shall be in the possession of the Principal of the College of Engineering for the time being.

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 2nd September 1908, No. 3154.

In G.O., No. 768, Educational, dated 18th November 1907, the Government accepted the offer of M.R.Ry. Rao Sahib S. Krishnamachariyar to endow a gold medal in the name of Mr. G. S. T. Harris in connection with the College of Engineering, Madras. They also requested the Director of Public Instruction to obtain two formal applications under the Charitable Endowments Act, one for vesting the endowment in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments and the other for settling a scheme for the administration of the property.

2. The Director of Public Instruction now submits the two applications called for, as well as two notifications, for publication in the *Fort St. George Gazette*.

3. In the notification settling the scheme of management, the 1st of October 1908 has been entered as the date on which the scheme should come into force. In line 2 of the same notification, the word "Counsel" has been corrected into "Council" and in line 4 of paragraph 1 of the schedule thereto, the word "administrated" has been corrected into "administered."

4. The notifications in other respects seem to call for no remarks and they may be published in the *Fort St. George Gazette*.

5. The draft order placed below is for approval.

The notifications are stated to have been prepared by the Government Solicitor and are as to form in accordance with precedents* except that the words "made by M.R.Ry. Rao Sahib S. Krishnamachariyar, B.C.E.," and "created by M.R.Ry. Rao Sahib S. Krishnamachariyar, B.C.E.," have been newly inserted. The insertion of these words seems to be unobjectionable and it is for consideration whether they may be allowed to stand. The scheme for the administration of the endowment appears to be complete.
