Approving the proposal of the Director of Public Instruction to open a fourth form class in the — and sanctioning the increase of the staff by two Eurasian mistresses on a salary of Rs. 75 and Rs. 50 *per mensem*.

Letter—from the Hon'ble Mr. A. G. BOURNE, D.Sc., F.R.S., C.I.E., Director of Public Instruction, Madras.

To—the Secretary to Government, Educational Department (through the Accountant-General).

I have the honour to request that you will be so good as to obtain the sanction of Government for the opening in January 1909 of a fourth form class in the Government Girls' school at Cannanore and for the creation of two new appointments one on Rs. 100 *per mensem* and another on Rs. 60 *per mensem*.

2. The institution is at present an incomplete secondary school working up to the third form and its gradual development as a complete secondary school will, I am inclined to think, give a decided impetus to the further spread of female education in Malabar. In setting forth the necessity for a complete secondary school, Miss Lynch, the Inspectress, writes as follows :—

“The demand for Malayalam-speaking women teachers of the secondary grade is far in excess of the supply and in consequence all the Government Girls' schools including the Training school, Calicut, are very poorly staffed. There is only one complete Girls' High school in the whole of Malabar, viz., the Basel German Mission Girls' High school, Calicut, which is unable to meet the wants of the mission itself. As pointed out in my annual report this year, the difficulty of obtaining secondary teachers for the girls' schools has now become so great that unless a few Government secondary schools are maintained which will meet this demand, the work of the schools will soon be so seriously hampered that future progress and further development will be rendered impossible.”

3. The school has now eight classes which will be increased to nine on the opening of the proposed fourth form, while the sanctioned staff consists of only seven teachers. Two more teachers will be needed if each class is to have a separate teacher, and if the headmistress is to do teaching work in addition to supervision. The Inspectress states that both the teachers should be Eurasians in addition to the present Eurasian headmistress, who will become an assistant under the revision, and that the proposed headmistress should be a B.A., L.T. To secure teachers of this stamp, it is necessary to offer the salaries I have proposed.

4. The necessary proposition and reappropriation statements are submitted, herewith, in duplicate.

Order—No. 692, Educational, dated 3rd October 1908.

The Government approve the proposal of the Director of Public Instruction to open a fourth form class in the Government Girls' school at Cannanore, and to increase the staff by the appointment of two Eurasian mistresses; but they consider that the salaries proposed for the two additional appointments, namely, Rs. 100 and Rs. 60 *per mensem*, respectively, are excessive. The salary of the Headmistress will be fixed at Rs. 75 and that of the First Assistant at Rs. 50 *per mensem*. With these alterations the proposition statement is sanctioned with effect from 1st January 1909.

2. The Director of Public Instruction will be requested to advertize for a duly qualified Headmistress and First Assistant teacher for the school on Rs. 75 and Rs. 50 *per mensem*, respectively.

[SUBJECT.—Additional establishment for the Government Girls' School, Cannanore.]

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 17th August 1908, No. 4557.

The Director of Public Instruction requests the sanction of Government for the opening in January 1909 of a fourth form class in the Government girls' school, Cannanore, and for the creation of two new appointments—one on Rs. 100 *per mensem* and the other on Rs. 60.

2. The Director states that the school is at present worked as an incomplete secondary school with the third form as its highest class. He thinks that the gradual development of the institution as a complete secondary school will give a decided impetus to the further spread of female education in Malabar.

3. The following are the reasons for proposing to raise the standard of the school:—

(1) "The demand for Malayalam-speaking women-teachers of the secondary grade is far in excess of the supply and in consequence all the Government girls' schools, including the Training school at Calicut, are very poorly staffed."

(2) The only one complete girls' high school in the whole of Malabar, viz., the Basel German Mission girls' high school, Calicut, "is unable to meet the wants of the mission itself."

(3) The difficulty of obtaining secondary teachers for the girls' schools "has now become so great that unless a few Government secondary schools are maintained, which will meet this demand, the work of the schools will soon be so seriously hampered that further progress and further development will be rendered impossible."

4. The present staff of the school consists of seven teachers as follows:—

5. The school has now eight classes which will be increased to nine on the opening of the proposed fourth form. If each class is to have a separate teacher, two more teachers will then be needed. Even then, the headmistress will have to do teaching work in addition to supervision.

6. The Director states that both the teachers to be newly appointed on Rs. 100 and on Rs. 60 should be Eurasians in addition to the present Eurasian headmistress, who will become an assistant under the revision, and that the proposed headmistress should be a B.A. and L.T. To secure teachers of this stamp, the Director considers it necessary to offer the salaries—Rs. 100 and Rs. 60—he has proposed.

7. If the proposals of the Director of Public Instruction are sanctioned, the additional cost during the current year will be Rs. 320 (Rs. 160 $\times$ 2). There is no provision in the budget to meet this cost; but the Director of Public Instruction proposes a reappropriation from "Salaries" under the minor head "College of Engineering".

8. It is for consideration whether the Director's proposals may be sanctioned.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SECRETARIAT.

(a) If a paper is marked to be printed urgently, the Superintendent of the section concerned should sign the Press slip. The Superintendent should exercise a careful discretion in the matter.

(b) Each letter, memorandum, or order, or set of orders, in the file of correspondence should be headed in succession with the Roman numeral I, II, III, etc., the number being written in red ink or blue chalk above the item. The particular papers to be printed in the special issue-copies should be indicated by the Roman numeral (I, II, etc.) by which that item has been headed in the correspondence file. All matter, including marginal remarks or references, to be printed should be written in ink and matter which should not be printed should be encircled. Initials and signatures that are not quite legible should be re-written distinctly.

(b¹) For rules regarding printing of notes, see the rules in G.O., No. 1220, Public, dated 30th November 1900.

(c) The number of copies and the details of distribution should be filled in by the Superintendent or Referencer concerned.

(d) In the absence of special instructions to the Press to keep matter standing for a specified period, ordinary papers of 8 pages and under will be kept standing for one week, and larger papers for two weeks only. The type of notes and of all confidential papers is distributed immediately after striking.

(e) This slip, properly and completely filled in, should accompany every paper sent to Press; it will be returned by the Press when proofs are furnished; it should be sent to the Press when a call is made for revised proofs or when a corrected proof is sent for striking. When finally returned by Press it should be filed with the original order or letter.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PRESS.

(a) If, in the opinion of the Superintendent of the Press, a paper has been marked urgent unnecessarily, he should send the Press slip to the Deputy Registrar with a remark to that effect.

(b) Unless a note to the contrary is made against the matter, pencil entries should not be printed. The Superintendent of the Press may bring to the notice of the Deputy Registrar any instance of incomplete or careless editing.

(c) Signature copies of letters to the Secretary of State or to the Government of India should be printed on hand-made paper.

(d) This slip should be returned by the Press to the Secretariat when proofs are furnished; it will be sent back to the Press when proofs are returned corrected and should be finally returned to the Secretariat when struck-off copies are supplied.

(e) The names of the Secretary and Members should be printed in full when they occur on the right hand side, but only the first time when they appear on the left side, the initials alone being printed later.
