I have the honour to submit copy of a letter No. 17547, dated 1st September 1908, from Mr. A. Burroughs Strange, Chief Engineer, Madras and Southern Mahratta Railway Company, Limited, to the Principal, College of Engineering, Madras, offering an endowment of Rs. 630 which is being subscribed by the officers of the late Madras Railway Company, with the object of instituting a prize in connection with the college to commemorate the services of Mr. J. H. Thompson, M.I.C.E., the last Chief Engineer of that Railway. I beg to recommend that the offer may be accepted with thanks and that the Accountant-General may be authorised to receive the amount. Should Government be pleased to accept it, the donor will, in order to place the matter on a proper legal footing, be requested to make two formal applications under the Charitable Endowments Act, one for vesting the endowment in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments and the other for settling a scheme for the administration of the fund.

I have the honour to inform you that a sum of Rs. 630 is being subscribed by officers of the late Madras Railway for the purpose of endowing a prize to be awarded annually at the College of Engineering; this is designed to commemorate the services of Mr. J. H. Thompson, M.I.C.E., the last Chief Engineer of that Railway.

Would you kindly let me know whether you are willing to accept the above sum for the purpose specified and, if so, whether you can obtain the necessary sanction of the Director of Public Instruction? and further I shall be greatly obliged by your suggesting a suitable class to compete for the prize.

The Government gladly accept the offer of Mr. Strange, made on behalf of the officers of the former Madras Railway Company, to endow, in connection with the College of Engineering, Madras, a prize in the name of Mr. J. H. Thompson, M.I.C.E., late Chief Engineer of that Railway.

2. The Accountant-General will be authorised to receive the amount remitted by Mr. Strange on account of this endowment and to purchase Government securities for the amount, reporting to the Director of Public Instruction the number of the securities purchased and the balance in cash, if any.

3. The Director of Public Instruction will be requested to obtain two formal applications under the Charitable Endowments Act, 1890, one for vesting the fund in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments and the other for settling a scheme for the administration of the endowment.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SECRETARIAT.

(a) If a paper is marked to be printed urgently, the Superintendent of the section concerned should sign the Press slip. The Superintendent should exercise a careful discretion in the matter.

(b) Each letter, memorandum, or order, or set of orders, in the file of correspondence should be headed in succession with the Roman numeral I, II, III, etc., the number being written in red ink or blue chalk above the item. The particular papers to be printed in the special issue-copies should be indicated by the Roman numeral (I, II, etc.) by which that item has been headed in the correspondence file. All matter, including marginal remarks or references, to be printed should be written in ink and matter which should not be printed should be encircled. Initials and signatures that are not quite legible should be re-written distinctly.

(b¹) For rules regarding printing of notes, see the rules in G.O., No. 1220, Public, dated 30th November 1900.

(c) The number of copies and the details of distribution should be filled in by the Superintendent or Referencer concerned.

(d) In the absence of special instructions to the Press to keep matter standing for a specified period, ordinary papers of 8 pages and under will be kept standing for one week, and larger papers for two weeks only. The type of notes and of all confidential papers is distributed immediately after striking.

(e) This slip, properly and completely filled in, should accompany every paper sent to Press; it will be returned by the Press when proofs are furnished; it should be sent to the Press when a call is made for revised proofs or when a corrected proof is sent for striking. When finally returned by Press it should be filed with the original order or letter.

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(a) If, in the opinion of the Superintendent of the Press, a paper has been marked urgent unnecessarily, he should send the Press slip to the Deputy Registrar with a remark to that effect.

(b) Unless a note to the contrary is made against the matter, pencil entries should not be printed. The Superintendent of the Press may bring to the notice of the Deputy Registrar any instance of incomplete or careless editing.

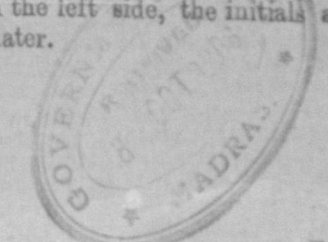
(c) Signature copies of letters to the Secretary of State or to the Government of India should be printed on hand-made paper.

(d) This slip should be returned by the Press to the Secretariat when proofs are furnished; it will be sent back to the Press when proofs are returned corrected and should be finally returned to the Secretariat when struck-off copies are supplied.

(e) The names of the Secretary and Members should be printed in full when they occur on the right hand side, but only the first time when they appear on the left side, the initials alone being printed later.
