Sanctioning the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Rs. 7,000 on vacation lectures to teachers to be delivered during the ensuing Christmas holidays.

With reference to G.O., No. 622, dated the 1st September 1908, I am directed to inform you that the Syndicate has arranged for courses of vacation lectures to teachers to be delivered during the next Christmas holidays which will cost Rupees 7,000 or thereabouts. It appears that the grant of Rs. 50,000 made by Government under this Government Order will not be available to any extent this year, if it is to be invested. The Syndicate, therefore, requests the sanction of Government for the provision of the said sum of Rs. 7,000 out of the income from the accumulated Fee fund of the University for the current year.

Order—No. 709, Educational, dated 12th October 1908.

Under section XV of the Act of Incorporation of the University (the Madras University Act, XXVII of 1857), the Government sanction the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Rs. 7,000, out of the income from the accumulated Fee fund of the University for the current year, on vacation lectures to teachers to be delivered during the ensuing Christmas holidays.

[SUBJECT.—*Provision of a sum of Rs. 7,000 on account of vacation lectures to be delivered during the ensuing Christmas Vacation out of the income from the accumulated Fee Fund of the University for the current year.*]

From the Registrar, University of Madras, dated 19th September 1908, No. 2769.

Please see the notes and orders with G.O., No. 622, Educational, dated 1st September 1908. In that order, sanction was accorded to a grant of Rs. 50,000 to the University of Madras towards the cost of establishing University vacation lectures, on the condition that this sum was invested in Government securities and that the interest on the investment was devoted to the purpose stated and not diverted therefrom without the special sanction of Government. It was also stated that, if further funds were required for this purpose, the University must find them from the Fee Fund or other funds belonging to the University.

2. The Registrar of the University (Mr. Dewsbury) now reports that the Syndicate has arranged for courses of vacation lectures to teachers to be delivered during the next Christmas holidays, which are expected to cost about Rs. 7,000, and that as the grant of Rs. 50,000 sanctioned by Government will not be available to any extent in the current year, if it is to be invested, the Syndicate requests the sanction of Government for meeting the cost of the lectures (Rs. 7,000) "out of the income from the accumulated Fee Fund of the University for the current year."

3. Section XV of the Act of Incorporation of the University (the Madras University Act, XXVII of 1857) authorises the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor and Fellows to charge fees for the degrees to be conferred and says: "such fees shall be carried to one general Fee Fund for the payment of expenses of the said University under the directions and regulations of the Governor of Fort St. George in Council" Please see also clause (e) of section 25 of the Indian Universities Act, 1904, which contemplates the appointment of Professors and Lecturers by the University.

4. From paragraph 2 of Dr. Bourne's letter, dated 3rd May 1908, it is observed that the accumulated Fee Fund of the University then stood at Rs. 6,00,000. The present proposal is to allot the sum of

Rs. 7,000 required for expenditure on vacation lectures, "out of the income from the accumulated Fee Fund" or, in other words, out of the interest realized on the fund. This interest amounted in 1906-1907 (when the accumulated fund was Rs. 5,50,000) to Rs. 8,416-8-4.

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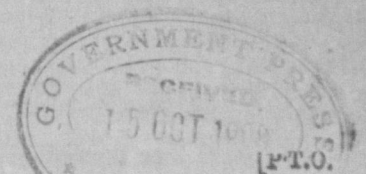
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
