Sanctioning the proposition statement for the employment of three additional peons in the Reformatory school, Chingleput.

GOVERNMENT OF MADRAS.

EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT.

READ—the following paper:—

Letter—from the Hon'ble Mr. A. G. BOURNE, D.Sc., F.R.S., C.I.E., Director of Public Instruction.

To—the Secretary to Government, Educational Department (through the Accountant-General, Madras).

I have the honour to request you will be so good as to obtain the sanction of Government to the entertainment, from 1st September next, of three additional peons on Rs. 8 each per mensem, in the Reformatory School, Chingleput.

2. The Superintendent reports that the 'big barrack' which was under repair has been taken over by him and is now used as a dormitory and that in consequence of this increased accommodation, the strength of the school which is at present fixed at 190 pupils will shortly be raised to 250, which will necessitate the entertainment of additional peons for purposes of control and effective supervision at night. It is further stated that the cubicle system of the 'big barrack' has been replaced by the hammock system and that as the hammocks are slung in the open room in two parallel rows, there is nothing to prevent a boy leaving his hammock except the presence of a peon on duty. Further, close supervision is rendered difficult by the fact that the several dormitories are located at some distance from each other.

There are, at present, 13 peons on the establishment and each one has on an average 10 hours' day duty and 4 hours' night duty. No redistribution of work will be possible unless the menial establishment is strengthened. The Superintendent considers that the guarding staff is quite undermanned and overworked and states that he is considerably handicapped when during the prevalence of epidemics, such as cholera, small-pox, mumps, etc., the peons who are exposed to infection are granted compulsory casual leave. I beg to add that when the new dormitory was taken over which substituted the hammock for the cubicle system the Government were pleased in G.O., No. 53, Educational, dated 1st February 1905, to sanction the entertainment of three peons and that the taking over of the 'big barrack' involves not only the same change in the sleeping system but a substantial increase in the strength of the school. I consider that the Superintendent has made out a good case for the employment of additional peons.

3. I submit, herewith, in duplicate, the necessary re-appropriation and proposition statements and request the favour of early orders.

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 21st August 1908, No. 4552.

The Director of Public Instruction requests the sanction of Government to the employment from 1st September 1908 of three additional peons on Rs. 8 each per mensem in the Reformatory School, Chingleput.

2. There are at present 14 peons in the Reformatory School on the following scale of pay:—

One head peon	15
One peon or warder	10
One do.	9
Three peons	8 each.
Three do.	7½ "
Five do.	7 "

3. The Superintendent of the Reformatory School gives the following reasons for the employment of additional peons:—

(1) The "big barrack" which was under repair has been taken over and is now used as a dormitory and as this provides increased accommodation the strength of the school which is at present fixed at 190 pupils will be raised to 250, necessitating the employment of additional peons for purposes of control and effective supervision at night.

(2) The cubicle system of the "big barrack" has been replaced by the hammock system and as the hammocks are slung in the open room in two parallel rows, there is nothing to prevent a boy leaving his hammock except the presence of a peon on duty. Further, close supervision is rendered difficult by the fact that the several dormitories are located at some distance from each other.

(3) Each peon has on an average 10 hours' day duty and 4 hours' night duty—altogether 14 hours' duty *per diem*.

(4) The guarding staff at present is quite undermanned and overworked so that the Superintendent is considerably handicapped when, during the prevalence of epidemics, such as cholera, small-pox, mumps, etc., the peons who are exposed to infection are granted compulsory casual leave.

4. The Director of Public Instruction points out that when the new dormitory was taken over which substituted the hammock for the cubicle system, the Government sanctioned the employment of three peons—*vide* G.O., No. 53, Educational, dated 1st February 1905—and that the taking over of the “big barrack” involves not only the same change in the sleeping system but a substantial increase in the strength of the school.

5. As the Director of Public Instruction points out the Superintendent seems to have made out a good case for the employment of additional peons and his proposal may, it is submitted, be sanctioned. There is no provision in the budget to meet the cost of the additional establishment proposed. The Director of Public Instruction therefore proposes a reappropriation of funds.

6. A draft order is submitted for approval. If approved, it may be sent to the Financial Department for acceptance.

The extra cost involved by the proposed additional establishment is Rs. 24 per mensem. This means an additional expenditure of Rs. 144 in the current year and of Rs. 288 per annum in the future.
