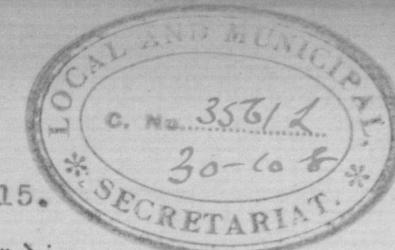

I have the honour to inform you that the postal and Telegraph authorities in the British East Africa Protectorate suggest to me the engagement of 3 Postal and Telegraph Learners or Probationers for training in their Post Office for the provision of an adequate staff of coloured Telegraphists, as the system of recruiting trained men from India has proved unsatisfactory.

2. The qualifications required of candidates and terms of service are enumerated in the accompaniment to this letter and I shall be greatly obliged if the Government of India will be so kind as to assist me in securing good and capable men through the Educational Authorities of the several Indian Local Governments.
