Letter—from the Hon'ble Mr. A. G. BOURNE, D.Sc., F.R.S., C.I.E., Director of Public Instruction, Madras.

To—the Secretary to Government, Educational Department.

I have the honour to submit, herewith, the following proposals for the additional staff required for the Kumbakónam College under the University Regulations.

The Principal states that two additional lecturers—one for English and the other for Physics and Chemistry—will be required. As Physics and Chemistry are to be taught in the college, a lecturer for these subjects will be necessary and he should, I think, be in the Provincial Service. With regard to the additional lecturer in English, it is reported that the staff of Mathematical lecturers (four including the temporary assistant) may admit of some reduction in 1909. I would suggest that the additional English assistant proposed may be employed temporarily for a year at the outset, the continuance of the appointment being determined after ascertaining the actual requirements of the college at the end of the year and that he be placed in the last class of the Subordinate Collegiate Service.

In this connection, I beg to submit that in the Government of India's letter No. 792, dated 15th October 1906, recorded in G.O., No. 842, Educational, dated 31st December 1906, sanction was accorded to the transfer of the appointment of Assistant Superintendent, School of Arts, included in the Provincial Educational Service to the post of First Assistant, Government Training College, Rajahmundry. But in the scheme of reorganization of Training schools submitted with my letter, Ref. on Cur. No. 5128-A/07, dated 29th August 1908, I proposed that the Training College at Rajahmundry be reduced to the status of a Secondary school, and if this proposal is accepted, there will be no need for the inclusion of the post of First Assistant in the Rajahmundry Training College in the cadre of the Provincial Educational Service. The Provincial Service appointment in the School of Arts may, therefore, I submit, be transferred on the reorganization of that institution to the Kumbakónam College for the proposed lecturership in Physics and Chemistry. It will thus be seen that there is only one appointment, viz., that proposed for the Rajahmundry College in my letter, Ref. on Cur. No. 3375, dated 10th September 1908, to be newly added to the cadre of the Provincial Educational Service in connection with the revision of the staff of Government colleges under the University Regulations, the rest being included in the Subordinate Collegiate Service.

As regards the inferior establishment, Mr. Hodges proposes the employment of a laboratory attender to assist the lecturer in Physics and Chemistry. This appointment is necessary and I beg to recommend that a pay of Rs. 10 per mensem be sanctioned for it.

I shall submit the necessary proposition statement on receipt of orders on this communication.

The Government accept the proposal of the Director of Public Instruction that the staff of the Kumbakónam College should be strengthened by the appointment of

- (1) an additional lecturer in Physics and Chemistry,
- (2) a laboratory attender on Rs. 10 per mensem, and
- (3) a temporary additional assistant for English on Rs. 100 per mensem for one year.

2. The appointment of lecturer in Physics and Chemistry will be included in the cadre of the Provincial Educational Service, but this appointment cannot be substituted for the post of Assistant Superintendent of the School of Arts, as the latter place is reserved for the post of First Assistant in the Rajahmundry Training College. The Governor in Council therefore considers that an addition should be made at once to the cadre of the Provincial Educational Service in order to provide for the proposed appointment, and the Government of India will be addressed accordingly. In the event of its being decided hereafter to abolish the first assistantship of the Rajahmundry Training College, the place of the Assistant Superintendent of the School of Arts may be taken by one of the headmasterships of the proposed Secondary Training schools.

3. The post of temporary assistant for English will for the present be outside the cadre of the Subordinate Educational Service. The question of including it in that service will be considered when a decision is arrived at on the question of the retention of the appointment after the expiry of one year for which it is now sanctioned.

B.A. DEGREE EXAMINATION.

Page 28 of G.O., No. 841, Educational, dated 27th December 1906. *Courses of study.*—Article 189 of the new University Regulations prescribes the following courses of study for the B.A. Degree Examination:—

Part I—English Language and Literature.

Part II—One of the following groups:—

- (i) Mathematics.
- (ii) (a) Physical Science (Physics).
(b) Physical Science (Chemistry).
- (iii) Natural Science.
- (iv) Logic, Psychology and Ethics.
- (v) History and Economics.
- (vi) Two languages already studied in the intermediate course with

portions of the history and literature of both languages.

2. *Subjects of affiliation.*—In his note, dated 11th June 1907, printed with G.O., No. 387, Educational, dated 18th June 1907, the Acting Director of Public Instruction (Mr. Logan) proposed that the Kumbakónam College should be affiliated to the University under the new Regulations in the following subjects:—

- (i) Mathematics,
- (iv) Logic, Psychology and Ethics,
- (v) History and Economics, and
- (vi) two languages already studied in the Intermediate course.

The Government approved this proposal and further directed that steps should be taken to introduce Physical Science also as a branch of affiliation—G.O., No. 387, Educational, dated 18th June 1907.

3. Under the old Regulations, the Kumbakónam College was affiliated to the University in the following branches, namely:—

- I. Mathematics.
- IV. Mental and Moral Science (Logic, Psychology and Ethics).
- V. History.

The additional subjects in which the College has now been affiliated are—

- (ii) (a) Physical Science (Physics), and
- (vi) two languages already studied in the Intermediate course.

Arrangements have now to be made for providing instruction in the two subjects above named.

4. No additional staff is proposed by the Director of Public Instruction for the course in subject (vi) (two languages already studied in the intermediate course). Under the new Regulations, no second language is compulsory for the Intermediate or the B.A. course; and the teachers who till now taught the second language under the old Regulations for the F.A. and B.A. classes will obviously be now available for giving instruction in the two languages forming optional group (vi).

5. *Additional staff required.*—The Principal of the College applies for the appointment of two additional lecturers—one for English and the other for Physics and Chemistry. But the Director considers that only one additional lecturer for Physics

With regard to the appointment of additional lecturer for Physics and Chemistry, the Director of Public Instruction considers that it should be included in the cadre of the Provincial Educational Service. He does not propose, however, the immediate addition of one appointment to the cadre of the Provincial Educational G.O., No. 842, Educational, dated 31st December 1906.

With regard to the additional lecturer required by the Principal for English, the Director points out that at present there is a staff * of four teachers for Mathematics and that this may admit of some reduction in 1909. Dr. Bourne therefore suggests that an additional Assistant for English may be employed temporarily for a year at the outset, the continuance of

in Physics and Chemistry in the Kumbakonam College may be added to the appointments which are to be newly added to the cadre of the Provincial Educational Service in connection with the revision of the teaching staff of the Government colleges under the new University Regulations.

8. As regards the temporary Assistant required for one year for teaching English, the Director of Public Instruction proposes that he may be placed in the 1st class of the Subordinate Educational Service, that is, on a salary of Rs. 100 per mensem. The temporary Assistant required for English may, it is submitted, be sanctioned for one year outside the cadre of the Subordinate Educational Service. If the appointment is to be included in the Subordinate Educational Service, the sanction of the Government of India will be necessary—vide article 76 (iii) of the Civil Service Regulations.

The average cost of the additional establishment is thus Rs. 526-10-8 per mensem or Rs. 6,320 per annum; but the initial cost of the proposal will be only Rs. 310 * per mensem or Rs. 3,720 per annum, as the starting pay of the Lecturer in the Provincial Educational Service will be only Rs. 200 per mensem.
