ABSTRACT.—Sanctioning the proposal of the trustees of the District Jubilee Scholarship Fund, South Canara, that the Accountant-General may be authorised to sell the Government securities held by him for the trustees and invest the fund in the purchase of municipal debentures and that he may be permitted to continue to be the custodian of the debentures proposed to be purchased by the trustees.

I am directed to forward for the orders of Government, letter No. 4500, dated 7th October 1908, from the District Judge and President, Jubilee Scholarship Fund, Mangalore, asking Government to sanction the investment of certain funds in Madras Municipal 4 per cent. debentures.

The Mangalore Jubilee Scholarship Funds, held on account of the Trustees of the Fund by the Accountant-General, at present consist of :—

- Rs. 17,000 invested in 4 per cent. Madras Municipal debentures,
- Rs. 400 invested in $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. Government paper,
- Rs. 2,706 cash balance.

2. The cash balance is steadily increasing, though slowly of recent years, as more boys are coming forward for the scholarships.

3. At a meeting of the Trustees of the Fund on 4th October 1908, the following resolutions were passed :—

(1) That the Government $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. promissory note of Rs. 400 be sold out, Rs. 2,500 be invested now in 4 per cent. debentures, and Rs. 500 be invested in 4 per cent. debentures next February.

4. Under article 173, Vol. I, Civil Account Code, it is necessary for Government to sanction the sale of the above promissory note of Rs. 400 and to give permission for the Accountant-General to invest and hold the funds in any other securities. Such permission was formerly granted with respect to the Rs. 17,000 held in the Madras Municipal debentures, in G.O., No. 260, Educational, dated 19th April 1898, and I therefore have the honour to request that Government will be good enough to sanction the proposal contained in the resolution given above and to permit the Accountant-General to invest the money referred to in 4 per cent. Madras Municipal debentures and hold the same.

EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT.

The Mangalore Jubilee Scholarship Funds at present consist of—

- (1) Rupees 17,000 invested in 4 per cent. Madras Municipal debentures;
- (2) Rupees 400 invested in $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. Government Promissory-notes; and
- (3) Rupees 2,706 cash.

2. Originally, the whole of the fund was invested in $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. Government securities and in G.O., No. 260, Educational, dated 19th April 1898, the Government sanctioned at the request of the trustees of the fund the sale of the Government securities and the re-investment of the money in Madras Municipal debentures. The trustees now request the sanction of Government to the sale of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. Government paper of the face value of Rs. 400 and to the investment of Rs. 3,000 in 4 per cent. Municipal debentures (Rs. 2,500 at once and Rs. 500 next February).
Vide also G.O., No. 230 Educational, dated 29th March 1895.

3. These Government securities and Municipal debentures are held by the Accountant-General on behalf of the trustees and, under article 173 II of the Civil Account Code, he cannot sell any of them without the orders of Government. As

the major portion of the fund is invested in Municipal debentures, there appears to be no objection to the sale of the Government Promissory-note for Rs. 400 and the investment of its sale-proceeds and the cash balance of Rs. 2,706, in 4 per cent. Municipal debentures.

4. The draft put up is submitted for approval.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE
SECRETARIAT.

(a) If a paper is marked to be printed
urgently, the Superintendent of the section
concerned should sign the Press slip. The
Superintendent should exercise a careful discre-
tion in the matter.

(b) Each letter, memorandum, or order, or set
of orders, in the file of correspondence should be
headed in succession with the Roman numeral I,
II, III, etc., the number being written in red ink
or blue chalk above the item. The particular
papers to be printed in the special issue-copies
should be indicated by the Roman numeral (I,
II, etc.) by which that item has been headed in
the correspondence file. All matter, including
marginal remarks or references, to be printed
should be written in ink and matter which should
not be printed should be encircled. Initials and
signatures that are not quite legible should be
re-written distinctly.

(b¹) For rules regarding printing of notes,
see the rules in G.O., No. 1220, Public, dated
30th November 1900.

(c) The number of copies and the details of
distribution should be filled in by the Superin-
tendent or Referencer concerned.

(d) In the absence of special instructions to
the Press to keep matter standing for a specified
period, ordinary papers of 8 pages and under
will be kept standing for one week, and larger
papers for two weeks only. The type of notes
and of all confidential papers is distributed
immediately after striking.

(e) This slip, properly and completely
filled in, should accompany every paper sent to
Press; it will be returned by the Press when
proofs are furnished; it should be sent to the
Press when a call is made for revised proofs or
when a corrected proof is sent for striking.
When finally returned by Press it should be
filed with the original order or letter.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PRESS.

(a) If, in the opinion of the Superintendent of
the Press, a paper has been marked urgent
unnecessarily, he should send the Press slip to
the Deputy Registrar with a remark to that
effect.

(b) Unless a note to the contrary is made
against the matter, pencil entries should not
be printed. The Superintendent of the Press
may bring to the notice of the Deputy Registrar
any instance of incomplete or careless editing.

(c) Signature copies of letters to the
Secretary of State or to the Government of
India should be printed on hand-made paper.

(d) This slip should be returned by the Press
to the Secretariat when proofs are furnished; it
will be sent back to the Press when proofs
are returned corrected and should be finally
returned to the Secretariat when struck-off
copies are supplied.
