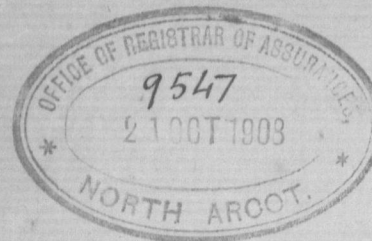

SUBJECT. Recommending that Muhammad Bazar Ali, a clerk, Sub. Registry Office, Pattala, may be permitted to appear for the Revenue and Criminal Judicial tests.

Muhammad Bazar Ali who entered the Registration Department last year as a clerk requests that he may be permitted to appear for the Criminal Judicial and Revenue tests for which he, being (an unpassed man), is ineligible to appear - vide Art. 4 of the Special Test notification. The S.G. of Registration (the Hon'ble Mr. R. V. Srinivasar) in submitting the application for the favourable consideration of Government states that the Sub. Registrar under whom he is serving reports very favourably about him.

2. It is, however, submitted that the Revenue and Criminal Judicial tests are not required for any of the posts in the Registration Deptt. The only posts in the Registration Department for which special tests are required are those of District Registrars and ~~the~~ ^{those} of Managers, and Accountants on Rs 50 and upwards, in the office of the S.G. of Registration. The Civil Judicial test and the Account test, Higher grade are prescribed for the ~~posts of~~ ^{posts of} District Registrars, and the Account test, Higher grade is prescribed for the latter posts.

3. It is for consideration whether Muhammad Bazar Ali may be permitted to appear for the Revenue and
