ABSTRACT.—Directing the publication in the *Fort St. George Gazette* of notifications vesting the Francis Cotton Walker Scholarship Endowment Fund in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments and settling a scheme for its administration.

By notification ordered in G.O., No. 476, Educational, dated 23rd June 1908, the "Francis Cotton Walker Scholarship Endowment" was vested in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments. A scheme for the administration of the endowment fund was also sanctioned in the Government Order referred to above. The Principal, College of Engineering, suggests to me as joint trustee of the fund that the value of the scholarship may be raised from Rs. 13 to Rs. 14 per mensem by adding to the corpus of the fund, viz., Rs. 4,500, the unexpended balance of the interest now amounting to about Rs. 500. I agree with him and, accordingly, have the honour to request that the necessary modification may be made in rule 3 of the scheme for the administration of the endowment fund.

2. As required by clause 2 of section (v) of the Charitable Endowments Act, I submit, herewith, a joint application signed by me and the Principal, College of Engineering, together with a draft notification on the subject prepared by the Government Solicitor, in duplicate, for the approval of Government.

3. The Government Solicitor considers that it is unnecessary that the whole scheme as modified should be published.

2. In that order, the Government vested the Francis Cotton Walker Scholarship Endowment Fund in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments and sanctioned a scheme for the administration of the fund.

3. Under paragraph 3 of the scheme of administration sanctioned in the above Government Order the value of the Francis Cotton Walker scholarship is Rs. 13 per mensem.

4. The Director of Public Instruction and the Principal of the College of Engineering who are the Trustees of the fund, now propose to raise the value of the scholarship from Rs. 13 to 14 by adding to the corpus of the fund, viz., Rupees 4,500, the unexpended balance of the interest amounting to Rs. 500, and request that paragraph 3 of the scheme approved in G.O., No. 476, Educational, dated 23rd June 1908, may be modified accordingly.

5. The proposal of the Director of Public Instruction and the Principal of the College of Engineering may be accepted and the draft notification submitted by them may be approved and published in the *Fort St. George Gazette*.

6. The draft below is for approval.

Paragraph 9 of the scheme for the administration of the Francis Cotton Walker
Page 5 of G.O., No. 476, Educational, dated scholarship approved in G.O., No. 476,
23rd June 1908. Educational, dated 23rd June 1908, says
that—

"All interest on the fund that may not be required or utilized for the said
"scholarship shall be accumulated and such accumulation shall, when possible, from
"time to time be invested in securities of the Government of India and be added to
"the principal amount of the fund."

2. It is now proposed to invest in Government securities the unexpended balance of interest amounting to Rs. 500 and to add it to the capital of the fund, and, as there will thus be an increase in the amount of interest realized, it is proposed to enhance the rate of the scholarship from Rs. 13 to Rs. 14 per mensem. Paragraph 3 of the scheme which prescribes the rate of the scholarship is to be amended and the sanction of Government is solicited for the modification of paragraph 3.

3. The receipts from interest will, with the enhanced capital, amount to $50 \times 3\frac{1}{2}$ or Rs. 175. The expenditure on the scholarship at the enhanced rate now proposed will be Rs. $14 \times 12 =$ Rs. 168. This will still leave a balance of Rs. 7 every year to be invested. The proposal may be approved.
