Delegating to certain heads of departments the power to sanction the re-employment of pensioners under article 524, Civil Service Regulations. *and the Secretaries to Govt in respect of their Office established*

I am directed to invite attention to paragraph 39 of the Memorandum containing the suggestions of the Government of Madras in regard to Decentralization forwarded with Mr. Bradley's letter No. 50, Pension, dated 20th January 1908, and to request that the local Government in the Presidency may be authorised to delegate to heads of departments noted in the margin the power to sanction, under article 524 of the Civil Service Regulations, the re-employment of pensioners when the employment is *bona fide* temporary and lasting for not more than a year, and provided that other suitable candidates are not available.

2. The proposal is recommended on the ground that it would secure a large reduction of petty work, and prevent the delay which often occurs at present in the issue of orders.

I am directed to acknowledge the receipt of your letter in the Pension department, No. 846-13, dated the 17th September 1908, in which it is requested that the local Government may be authorised to delegate to certain heads of departments in the Madras Presidency the power to sanction the re-employment of pensioners under article 524 of the Civil Service Regulations.

2. In reply I am to convey sanction to the delegation by the local Government of their power to the officers specified in respect of pensioners who, having been non-gazetted officers, are in receipt of a pension of not more than Rs. 100 a month, when the employment is *bona fide* temporary and lasting for not more than a year, and provided that other suitable candidates are not available.

3. The Governor-General in Council regrets that he is unable to accept the proposal of the Madras Government in its entirety.

In one case (G.O., No. 717, Pension, dated 11th November 1908), the Government of India has *rejected* the recommendation. In one case, the delegation has been *held over*.
