In pursuance of the instructions in your favour dated 8th August referring to No. 5133 of 1907, I have the honour to send herewith the two plans with estimates having made the corrections noted by the Chief Engineer of the Public Works Department, i.e.—

(2) *European hostel*.—Sections C—C and D—D marked on the plans, also showing positions of the verandah posts.

(3) Scantlings of the existing terraced roof which it is proposed to convert into a floor have been marked on the plan. They were carefully examined when the premises were put in order two years ago and all defective joists replaced by new ones.

In reference to (No. 1), as the "Institute" was not sanctioned, the plans and estimates for same have been returned to us so that details will not be necessary.

Note by the Chief Engineer, Public Works Department.

The Director of Public Instruction submits estimates, amounting to Rs. 3,600 and Rs. 7,500, for adding an upper floor to the European hostel of the Young Women's Christian Association at Madras and for additions to the same Association's hostel for natives.

The roof scantlings of the former building are found to be of insufficient strength for the purpose of a floor—the additional work required to strengthen this has been provided for in an additional estimate, amounting to Rs. 710, which has been prepared in the Chief Engineer's office and attached to the estimates submitted. By this and other necessary alterations made in the Chief Engineer's office the amount of this estimate has been increased to Rs. 4,145.

By alterations made in the Chief Engineer's office the amount of the estimate for the hostel for natives has been reduced to Rs. 7,193.

The estimates, as altered by the Chief Engineer, amounting to Rs. 4,145 and Rs. 7,193, respectively, are recommended for sanction.

The Government are pleased to sanction a grant of Rs. 3,200 or one-third of the actual expenditure, whichever is less, towards the cost of improvement and extension of the hostels for Indian and European students attached to the Young Women's Christian Association, Madras, subject to the following conditions :—

(3) that a certificate of the actual expenditure incurred on the work is submitted before the 1st July 1909 ;

(4) that the amount expended on the work does not fall short of Rs. 9,600 as actually verified ;

(5) that all other conditions prescribed in the Grant-in-Aid Code have been duly complied with ; and

(6) that the following special conditions are accepted, namely,—

(a) that the rules of the hostels, including regulations regarding rent and boarding charges, should be subject to the approval of the Director of Public Instruction ;

(b) that students of recognized institutions who ask for admission and are eligible for it should have priority of claim to all other applicants ; that after students, the claims of teachers of recognized institutions must be considered ;

(c) that no student should be admitted without the written consent of the principal of the institution in which she is studying ; and

(d) that there should be hostel committees on which the institutions from which the students mainly come are adequately represented.

2. Subject to the above conditions, the grant will be paid as funds become available.

The draft order placed below is submitted for approval.

2. The amount of grant promised in G.O., No. 577, Educational, dated 5th August 1908, is Rs. 3,200 and this amount has been entered in the draft order. The estimate as now altered by the Chief Engineer, however, amounts to Rs. 11,338.

Under article 51 of the Grant-in-Aid Code a grant not exceeding one-third of Rs. 11,338, or Rs. 3,779, may be sanctioned. It is for orders whether this amount may be sanctioned.

3. The Public Works Department has not stated the probable time within which the work may be completed. That department may be requested u.o. to furnish the information.

In G.O., No. 577, Educational, dated 5th August 1908, the Government undertook to sanction under article 51 of the Grant-in-Aid Code a grant not exceeding Rs. 3,200 or one-third of the cost of the improvement and extension of the hostels for Indian and European students attached to the Young Women's Christian Association, Madras, whichever was less, provided that the estimates were revised

in accordance with the suggestions contained in the Chief Engineer's note,* dated 18th July 1908. It was stated that the estimates when revised should be submitted for further scrutiny.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SECRETARIAT.

(a) If a paper is marked to be printed urgently, the Superintendent of the section concerned should sign the Press slip. The Superintendent should exercise a careful discretion in the matter.

(b) Each letter, memorandum, or order, or set of orders, in the file of correspondence should be headed in succession with the Roman numeral I, II, III, etc., the number being written in red ink or blue chalk above the item. The particular papers to be printed in the special issue-copies should be indicated by the Roman numeral (I, II, etc.) by which that item has been headed in the correspondence file. All matter, including marginal remarks or references, to be printed should be written in ink and matter which should not be printed should be encircled. Initials and signatures that are not quite legible should be re-written distinctly.

(b) For rules regarding printing of notes, see the rules in G.O., No. 1220, Public, dated 30th November 1900.

(c) The number of copies and the details of distribution should be filled in by the Superintendent or Referencer concerned.

(d) In the absence of special instructions to the Press to keep matter standing for a specified period, ordinary papers of 8 pages and under will be kept standing for one week, and larger papers for two weeks only. The type of notes and of all confidential papers is distributed immediately after striking.

(e) This slip, properly and completely filled in, should accompany every paper sent to Press; it will be returned by the Press when proofs are furnished; it should be sent to the Press when a call is made for revised proofs or when a corrected proof is sent for striking. When finally returned by Press it should be filed with the original order or letter.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PRESS.

(a) If, in the opinion of the Superintendent of the Press, a paper has been marked urgent unnecessarily, he should send the Press slip to the Deputy Registrar with a remark to that effect.

(b) Unless a note to the contrary is made against the matter, pencil entries should not be printed. The Superintendent of the Press may bring to the notice of the Deputy Registrar any instance of incomplete or careless editing.

(c) Signature copies of letters to the Secretary of State or to the Government of India should be printed on hand-made paper.

(d) This slip should be returned by the Press to the Secretariat when proofs are furnished; it will be sent back to the Press when proofs are returned corrected and should be finally returned to the Secretariat when struck-off copies are supplied.

(e) The names of the Secretary and Members should be printed in full when they occur on the right hand side, but only the first time when they appear on the left side, the initials alone being printed later.
