ABSTRACT.—Declining to entertain the claim put forward by Mr. James, Professor of Engineering, College of Engineering, for travelling allowance to England and back, while on deputation to visit some of the chief engineering laboratories attached to technical colleges in the United Kingdom during the last summer vacation.

I have considered in Council the letter of Your Excellency's Government, No. 278, Financial, dated the 17th September last, on the subject of the payment to Mr. W. H. James, Principal of the College of Engineering, Madras, of the cost of his passage to and from England on the occasion of his visit to this country during the summer vacation of the college in 1907.

2. In view of the explanation now received from the Government of Madras with regard to the circumstances of the case, I sanction the payment to Mr. James of the cost of his passage, as recommended by Your Excellency's Government in their letter No. 92, Financial, dated the 19th March last.

With reference to your Public despatch No. 67, dated the 15th May 1908, we have the honour to forward for Your Lordship's consideration a copy of a letter from the Government of Madras, submitting a further representation on the subject of the payment to Mr. W. H. James, Principal of the College of Engineering, Madras, of the cost of his passage to and from England on the occasion of his deputation during the summer vacation of the college in 1907.

2. In his letter of the 3rd November 1907 Mr. James has clearly explained the position, and it is evident that he was not to blame in the matter. He gave up all his vacation to work on behalf of Government and incurred the expense of a journey to England and back, instead of enjoying his vacation at Ootacamund on full pay. In the circumstances now explained by the Government of Madras we trust that Your Lordship will be willing to reconsider the decision on Mr. James' case and grant him the cost of his passage to and from England.
