May it please your Excellency,

Your Excellency's humble petitioner is the daughter of the late Salarjung, Bakshi-ul-mulk Bahdur, commander-in-chief of the forces of the last Nawab of Carnatic and the grand daughter of the Durbar Secretary, Dabeer-ul-mulk Bahdur, to the same Nawab. All her relations in addition to the two mentioned above also held eminent positions under the same Nawab on whose demise they were all given liberal pensions by Your Excellency's benign Government with a view to the up-keeping of their position and prestige. Your Excellency's petitioner also was allowed a pension of Rs 30-per month, under G.O. dated 12th November 1859, number 664., which was however subsequently reduced to Rs 15-on the ground that she then had very rich relatives to help her



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As time rolled on her relatives died one after the other. So much so the petitioner was left alone with the scanty pension of Rs 15 to live upon. Your Excellency's petitioner had therefore to live with her son.

As his family increased without any substantial addition to his salary, Your Excellency's petitioner, endeavoured to educate three of her grand children, at a time when the standard of education was rather high. The eldest of the three obtained a graduate-ship with credit. But it was very unfortunate with the second son, Muhammad Haider Mahagar, as is clear from his school certificate given to him by his kind Headmaster of the Government Madrassa-i-anzam, Mr. C.W. Mess M.A, a copy of which is herewith submitted for Your Excellency's kind perusal. He tried his hardest, notwithstanding the attack of Typhoid fever, he then had, and contrary to medical advice, to pass the Matriculation Examination, but was unsuccessful. Owing to my inability to further support him, he was compelled to discontinue his studies. Then he was kindly entertained, in April 1909, in the Custom House by Mr. C.G. Tedhunter, the then Collector of Sea-Customs, Madras, on Rs 20 as a Preventive Officer. Now I appeal to Your Excellency's mercy and pray that your Excellency will be graciously moved to exempt my above mentioned grandson, Md. Haider Mahajir, Preventive Officer, Sea-Customs, from the Examination rules with a view to his securing promotion to the higher grades of the Preventive service.

The petitioner is well aware that her humble prayer is not a great one as there are several instances in which Government have saved children of less respectable families than your petitioner's family by exempting them from examination rules and thus affording them facilities for promotion to higher grades in Your Excellency's benign Government.

The humble petition is submitted through the Collector of Sea-Customs, Madras, with a view to his work and conduct as a Preventive Officer, being certified to as has reason to believe that the said Md. Haider Mehajir has given all his superiors every satisfaction in the discharge of his duties.

In conclusion the humble petitioner prays leave to point out that Messers Baquer Ali Khan Deputy Superintendent of Police, Abbas Hussain Sahib of the Postal Department, and Ahmed Ali Mehkri a Preventive Officer of the Madras Sea-Customs, who also came from the same family have been shown similar, kind, concessions.

The petitioner, as in duty bound, ever pray for Your Excellency's long life and prosperity.

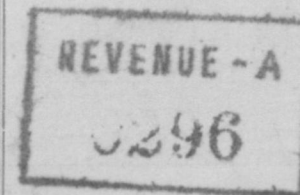
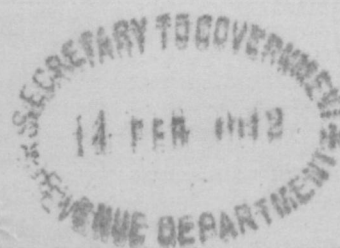

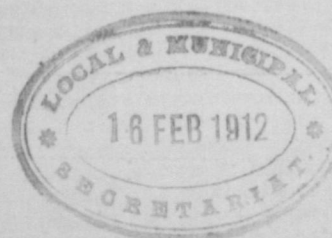
