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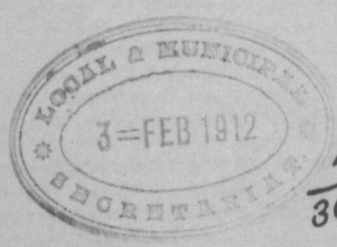
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The proposals submitted by Mr. Chatterton for the reorganization of the Technical Institute at Madura are still under consideration. The file on the subject was sent to the Finl. Department on the 8th January 1912.

2. The teaching of woodcarving in the Madura Institute was discontinued ^{it was thought that} as the Madras School of Arts was ~~deemed~~ sufficient to supply the teaching needs of the whole Presidency. Please see para 6 of Mr. Cotton's memo on pages 6 and 7 of G.O. No. 2617 Rev., dated 10th August 1910, and para 4 (ii) of the notes with that G.O. - page 7. + the Hon. W. Atkinson's remarks on page 8 of the G.O.
3. The following answer is suggested:-
