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The answer given to the Hon'ble Mr. Kameswara Rao's question at the meeting of the Legislative Council held on the 12th March 1910 will be found on page 2 of G.O. No. 128 Edl., dated 17th March 1910. Recently a memorial was received from the Uriya Samaj, Ganjam, requesting that the incomplete secondary school at Russellkonda might be made a complete secondary school in the course of three years by the opening of the fourth, fifth and sixth forms. This memorial has been referred to the D.P.I. for report under Endt. No. 60-1, Edl., dated 11th January 1912 and his report has not yet been received.

2. The following draft answer is submitted for approval:-

"The further orders referred to at the end of the answer given to the question cited were issued in March 1910 and stated that owing to the great difficulty of obtaining qualified Uriya teachers, the Govt. regretted their inability to accede to the requests of the inhabitants of Geomsur division that an English High School might be established at Russellkonda, that English schools of lower grade might be opened in large villages in the neighbourhood and that Uriya teachers might be employed in the proposed new schools. The question of raising the standard of the Board Secondary School at Russellkonda is now under consideration in connection with certain representations received in January 1912 from the Uriya Samaj, Ganjam".
