ABSTRACT.—Sanctioning the payment of a subsidy of Rs. 3,600 to the district board of Kurnool on account of the charges connected with the revision of the elementary school establishments in the district and the retention of the sessional school at Kurnool.

G.O. No. 803, Educational, dated 18th November 1911.

ABSTRACT.—Authorizing the Accountant-General to pay a sum of Rs. 15,000 to the district board of Kurnool as educational subsidy for the current year.

2. Out of the sanctioned allotment of Rs. 2,10,000 for contributions to local boards (subsidies) a sum of Rs. 1,913 has already been paid to the Palghat Taluk Board with reference to G.O. Mis. No. 500 L., dated 1st April 1911, for payment of capitation allowance to teachers of the schools under the board, and a subsidy of Rupees 15,000 has been paid to the Kurnool District Board as mentioned already. In this office letter C. No. 1144, dated 13th February 1912 (which has been submitted through the Accountant-General), sanction has been requested for the appropriation of Rupees

26,000 for payment of teaching grants to elementary schools for the current year. The balance available out of the allotment is thus Rs. 1,67,087 (Rs. 2,10,000—Rs. 42,913) from which the contributions recommended in paragraph 1 may be paid. The remaining balance, viz., Rs. 2,877, will be reserved for payment of the net cost of the Board High school, Chittoor, for which application has not yet been received.

Memorandum No. 480-1, Educational, dated 21st February 1912.

With reference to his letter C. No. 1172, dated 13th February 1912, the Director of Public Instruction is requested to state at a very early date whether in fixing the contribution to the Kurnool District Board at Rs. 4,900 he has taken into account the grant of Rs. 3,600 paid to that board under G.O. No. 391, Educational, dated 26th June 1911, and if not, whether the contribution proposed to be paid to it should not be reduced by Rs. 3,600.

With reference to Government Memorandum No. 480-1, Educational, dated 21st February 1912, I have the honour to state that as the subsidy of Rs. 3,600 sanctioned in G.O. Mis. No. 391, Educational, dated 26th June 1911, was in addition to the provisional contribution of Rs. 16,300 taken credit for in the Kurnool district board budget for 1911-12, it was assumed that its payment was subject to specific sanction along with the payment of the contribution actually payable to the district board in lieu of the provisional amount entered in the budget. If it has already been paid, the contribution of Rs. 4,900 recommended to the board in my letter C. No. 1172, dated 13th February 1912, should be reduced by Rs. 3,600. This does not affect the balance, viz., Rs. 2,877 mentioned in the concluding portion of my letter referred to.

From the Director of Public Instruction, No. 1172, dated 13th February 1912.

In the current year's budget under the head 22-I. Education—Miscellaneous there is a provision of 3.10 lakhs for contribution to local boards (subsidies). G.O. No. 68, Educational, dated 4th February 1911.

Out of this provision a sum of one lakh, intended for starting new elementary schools, has already been distributed in G.O. No. 708, Educational, dated 9th October 1911. From the balance of 2.10 lakhs, a sum of Rs. 20,513* has already been paid to the Palghat Taluk Board and the Kurnool District Board. The amount paid to the Kurnool District Board is Rs. 18,600 and not Rs. 15,000 as stated

by the Director of Public Instruction who has omitted to take into account the grant of Rs. 3,600 sanctioned in G.O. No. 391, Educational, dated 26th June 1911.

Hence the amount now available for distribution is Rs. 1,89,487, † and if out of this amount Rs. 1,64,210 were distributed among 13 district boards as proposed by the Director of Public Instruction, the it would not allow of Rs. 26,000 being reappropriated for payment of teaching grants to elementary schools and Rs. 2,877 being reserved for payment of the net cost of the Board High school, Chittoor. The Director of Public Instruction may therefore be asked to state whether in fixing the subsidy to the Kurnool District Board at Rs. 4,900 he has taken into account the grant of Rs. 3,600 paid to that board under G.O. No. 391, Educational, dated 26th June 1911, and if not, whether the proposed subsidy to that board should not be reduced by Rs. 3,600. If the Director replies in the affirmative, Rs. 1,60,610 may be distributed among 13 district boards, Rs. 26,000 may be reappropriated for payment of teaching grants to elementary schools and Rs. 2,877 reserved for payment of the net cost of the Board High school, Chittoor.

2. A draft reference to the Director of Public Instruction is submitted for approval. After its issue, the file may be sent to the Local and Municipal Department for remarks as to whether the proposals of the Director of Public Instruction may be accepted.

The cases in which the distribution now proposed differs from the provisional distribution in the budget for 1911-12 are noted on in the following paragraphs.

2. *North Arcot.*—Credit was allowed provisionally in the budget for a grant of Rs. 2,470 on account of the yeomiah and orphan school at Arcot; but in the proposed distribution the Director of Public Instruction does not provide for this apparently in view of the circumstance that this amount is met from a separate provision. This does not therefore call for any remark.

Please see paragraph 2 of his letter on page 3 of G.O. No. 187, Educational, dated 30th March 1911.

3. *Cuddapah.*—The Director of Public Instruction proposes that this District Board should be given Rs. 200 in excess of Rs. 5,500 for which credit was provisionally allowed. In view of the backward state of the District, no objection need be taken to this increase. It is noted that in the revised budget the Board has taken credit for the enhanced grant.

4. *Ganjam.*—Credit was allowed for Rs. 60 on account of gymnastic instructor in the High school at Russellkonda. In the distribution proposed by the Director of Public Instruction, however, no grant has been entered for the Ganjam District Board, apparently in view of G.O. No. 205, Educational, dated 10th April 1911, in which this contribution has been discontinued.

5. *Kurnool.*—The Director of Public Instruction has been addressed in the Educational Department in regard to the amount of grant to this district board and his reply may be awaited.

With these remarks the file may be returned to the Educational Department.

From the Director of Public Instruction, R.C. No. 1172, dated 27th February 1912.

The Director of Public Instruction states that he has not deducted the grant of Rs. 3,600 sanctioned in G.O. No. 391, Educational, dated 26th June 1911, and if that grant has already been paid, the subsidy proposed for the Kurnool District Board may be reduced by Rs. 3,600. The grant of Rs. 3,600 has already been paid—vide paragraph 1 of Accountant-General's letter, dated 10th October 1911, on page 2 of G.O. No. 803, Educational, dated 18th November 1911. The subsidy recommended for the District Board of Kurnool may accordingly be reduced by Rs. 3,600.
