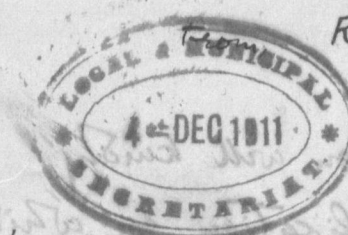

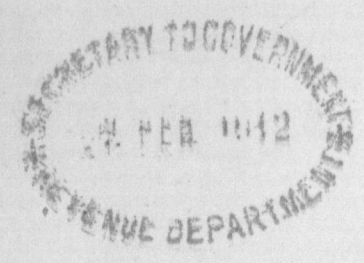

G. The Catalogue of Sanskrit manuscripts are now
distributed free to the persons and institutions in and
outside India mentioned in the Govt. of India list
printed in G.O. 793 E.O. 6. 12. 06. If Mr. R. G.
Vaidya really deserves the concession, he might as well have
applied to the Govt. of India and got his name included
in the list. That will entitle him to obtain the Sanskrit
publications of all Govts. There is, however, no
objection to furnishing him with the books he
applies for. Before passing orders on his application
the Govt. of the Central Provinces may be requested to
state whether the application is deserving of consideration.
