Miss W. Philip Smith, an assistant in the Brecks'
Memorial School, Ootacamund, who lost her appointment owing
to the abolition of the school was re-employed in January
last as Headmistress of the Government Girls' School,
Nellore Town, on the new scale of pay, viz., Rs. 65/- per
mensem, and deputed to undergo a course of training in the
Presidency Training School for Mistresses for a period of
one year from the 1st February last. She has had experience
as a teacher in European Schools, but she was untrained and
it was considered desirable that to be of use in schools
for native girls she should undergo a course of training.
She has been permitted to draw, while under training, an
allowance of Rs. 65/- per mensem which is the pay of her
substantive appointment, and the following acting arrange-
ments

arrangements have been made for the conduct of her duties during her deputation :-

(1) V. Vedavalli Ammal, 1st Assistant of the School on Rs. 20/-, to act as Headmistress on a salary of Rs. 30/- (pay Rs. 20/- plus acting allowance limited to Rs. 10/- per mensem).

(2) A. Kanakavalli Ammal (outsider) to act as 1st Assistant on a salary of Rs. 20/- vice No. (1).

I have the honour to request that Government will be pleased to sanction the extra cost amounting to Rs. 30/- per mensem which has to be incurred in consequence of the deputation of Miss W. Philip Smith to undergo a course of training.

Miss Smith's allowance cannot be reduced as she was in receipt of a pay of Rs. 75/- as Assistant Mistress in the Brecks' Memorial School.
