Meare see Gono 82 Eddy 1st February 1912 in which the Govt. agreed to bear one half of the cost (not exceeding Rs 270 per annum) of providing conveyances for pupils attending the Govt. Muhammadan Girls' School, Mylapore. But the date from which the Govt. was to take effect not having been specified the S.P.D. requests that effect may be given to it from 1st March 1912.

2. There is no objection to the Director's proposal being accepted. The amount due for 1911-12 is only Rs 194 which the S.P.D. can easily reappropriate from the budget provision of 1912-13.

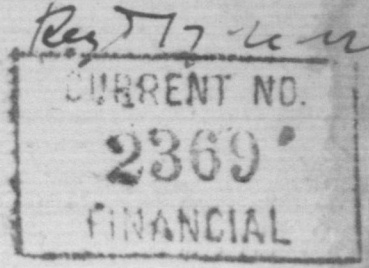
