Sir,

With reference to para 2 of Government Memorandum No. 2476-1, Educational, dated 28th November 1911, I have the honour to report that the Collector of Madras estimates the site selected for the construction of a Students' Hostel in Georgetown at a sum between 50 and 75 thousand rupees, excluding the compensation to be paid for the loss of business and the 15 per cent allowed for compulsory acquisition and enquires whether in view of the great cost he may proceed with the acquisition of the site. I submit a copy of the Collector's letter for the orders of Government.

In reply to your letter Ref on Cl. No. 68 of 1911, dated the 6th January 1912, I have the honour to state that the site you have selected for the construction of a Students' Hostel in Georgetown is situated at the southern extremity of the Broadway where properties are valuable and command high rents from their situation in an important business locality. On a personal inspection, I consider that the value of the property to be acquired may be put down at anything between Rs. 50,000 and Rs. 75,000 besides the compensation that may have to be paid for the loss of business and the 15 per cent allowed for compulsory acquisition under the Land Acquisition Act. In view of the great cost, I request you to be so good as to inform me if you wish me to proceed with the acquisition of the site. I would suggest your consulting the President, Corporation of Madras, with a view to acquiring a less costly site.

2. On hearing from you, I shall furnish you with a detailed valuation of the site under reference.

The Govt have, at present, under their consideration a scheme to make the Victoria Students' hostel at Chepauk the residential part of the Presidency College. In order to secure this object measures are in progress to alter the constitution of the Madras Students' Hostels Association - vide G.O. 559 E.O. 25-6-12. The construction of a hostel in Georgetown to accommodate the students of the Law, Christian and Pachaiyappa's Colleges was considered a necessary part of this scheme. ~~Accordingly in para. 2~~ Accordingly in para. 2 of memo. No. 2476-1 E.O. 28-11-11 the D.P.D. was requested to submit a detailed estimate and scheme for a hostel in Georgetown intended primarily for the students of those three Colleges and also to obtain a valuation statement of the site required for the hostel from the Collector of Madras. The D.P.D.'s current letter is in reply to this memo.

2. Since the issue of the reference to the D.P.D. the proposal to construct a hostel in Georgetown has undergone material modification. In the notes on pages 9 to 11 of G.O. 517 E.O. 14th June 1912 ^(Sd/- Governor) pointed out that as the Pachaiyappa's authorities had arranged to have a separate hostel for themselves, the Govt might advantageously give the authorities of

for themselves,

the Christian and Pachayappa's Colleges grants in aid of Constructing hostels attached to those colleges and reduce the scheme for the George-town hostel to a small one confined exclusively to the Law College students. He added that the ^{latter} question need not be taken up immediately. Though the Govt. have not ^{yet} examined the details of this proposal and given ^{their final} ~~their~~ assent thereto, it seems inevitable that in the local ~~of the Pachayappa's College providing a separate hostel, the original~~ ~~their approval in that case the~~ scheme will either ^{have to} be given up entirely or it will end in the construction of a small hostel for the Law college. In either case, it seems premature to acquire a site immediately, nor is it likely that a site costing Rs 50,000 to Rs 75,000 will be required by Govt. Submitted that the acquisition of the site may be deferred and the S.P.D may be informed accordingly.

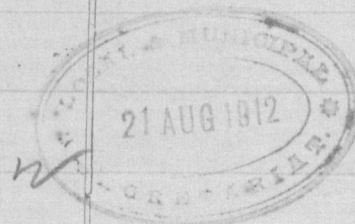
