ABSTRACT.—Approving generally the proposals submitted by the Director of Public Instruction for the opening of thirteen new elementary schools for girls and the addition of a training section to the Government girls' school, Karuntattangudi, Tanjore.

In continuation of my letter Ref. on Cur. No. 1877, dated 17th June 1912, submitting proposals for the opening of new Government girls' schools, I have the honour to request that you will be so good as to obtain the sanction of Government for the opening of a Government Muhammadan girls' school at Ellore in addition to the Hindu girls' school already proposed to be opened in the station. The Inspectress of Girls' Schools, Northern Circle, reports that the Muhammadan population of Ellore is very large and that several representations have been made to her from time to time for the establishment of a Government Muhammadan school there and recommends the opening of a school on the scale of staff and salaries proposed for the Hindu girls' school, viz., six teachers on Rs. 20, Rs. 15, 2 (Rs. 12) and 2 (Rs. 10).

In that Government Order the Government sanctioned the opening of thirteen elementary schools for girls, and of those only two were for Muhammadan girls—one in the central circle at Tiruppattūr and the other in the southern circle at Palghat. In the present current the Director of Public Instruction proposes to open a school for Muhammadan girls at Ellore in the northern circle. He states that the Muhammadan population of Ellore is very large and that several representations had been made from time to time for the establishment of a Government institution there for the girls of that community. The former statement does not appear to be, however, quite accurate. The Muhammadan population of Ellore, according to the census of 1911, is 3,894 out of a total population of 37,819, almost the whole of the remaining population being Hindu. Of the Muhammadans 1,928 are males and 1,966 females. Based on a calculation of 15 *per cent.* of the latter figure, the number of Muhammadan girls of school-going age is 294. In any case there appears to be at present no schools for Muhammadan girls at Ellore, nor in the whole of the Kistna district. Though there may be other places which have a greater Muhammadan population than Ellore, there seems to be no reason why the Director's proposal to establish one at Ellore should not be approved.

3. *Staff.*—The Director of Public Instruction proposes a staff of six teachers for the school as follows:—

Apparently the school is to have at least six standards, and the Director of Public Instruction is presumably satisfied that all the classes in the proposed school will have an adequate strength. The rates of pay proposed are those allowed for teachers in Hindu girls' schools. Though the teachers in Muhammadan girls' schools are allowed a higher scale of pay (*cf.* G.Os. Nos. 515, Educational, dated 8th August 1907 and 715, Educational, dated 5th August 1912) it appears to be sufficient for the present to accept the Director of Public Instruction's proposal in this respect.

4. The cost of the opening of the school involves a recurring expenditure of Rupees 1,218 *per annum* and of a non-recurring expenditure of Rs. 300. The Director proposes that the cost of the school should be met from the Imperial grant of Rs. 87,000 for the education of girls. But the cost of the thirteen schools sanctioned in G.O. No. 715,

Educational, dated 5th August 1912, and of the conversion of the Karantattangudi girls' school into a training school for mistresses, in accordance with the modifications

introduced by Government, amounts to only Rs. 22,010 * *per annum* and there is thus a saving of nearly Rs. 3,000 in the recurring grant of Rs. 25,000 assigned from Provincial funds for the opening of new girls' schools, and the cost of the present school may be met from the above saving. It is not stated from what date

the school is to be started. Even if it is opened immediately the amount required for the current year can be met from the provision of Rs. 25,000 in the budget. If these suggestions are approved, the file may be sent to the Financial Department for remarks.

The extra cost involved in the proposals for the opening of a Government Muhammadan girls' school at Ellore is—

Rupees 1,218 *per annum, recurring*; and
„ 300 „ *non-recurring*.

The Director of Public Instruction states that the cost of the above school may be met from the sum of Rs. 87,000 *per annum* for the education of girls included in the Imperial recurring grant of eight

lakhs for popular education. The Educational Department, however, point out that the cost may be met from the balance † of the sum of Rs. 25,000 provided from Provincial funds in the current year's budget (intended to be a recurring one) at the recommendation of the Finance

Committee for the opening of additional elementary schools for girls.

2. It is submitted for orders whether, in the matter of the source from which the cost is to be met, the proposal of the Director of Public Instruction may not be accepted, since it is highly desirable to utilize the *Imperial* grant as far as possible in the first instance. So far as this department is aware, the sum of Rs. 87,000 for the education
