The humble petition of A. Venkayya Head Clerk in charge of the Sub-Divisional Police Office, Hospet, Bellary District.

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:—

1. That Your Excellency's humble petitioner has put in a Service of 13 years in the Police Department and has been Head Clerk in charge of the Office of the Assistant Superintendent of Police, Hospet, for the last 3 years.
2. That in consideration of the good work done by him in various capacities from the time he joined the department he was strongly recommended by the Inspector General of Police, Madras, for promotion to the grade of Sub Inspector, but this recommendation was not given effect to on the ground that the petitioner was not qualified under the examination Rules in force.
3. That in this connection Your Excellency's humble petitioner begs to submit that he passed the Upper Primary and the Lower Secondary Examinations in 1889 and 1892 respectively and appeared for the Metriculation Examination in 1895 of which he passed the English and Telugu portions, and that he was prevented from further prosecuting his studies owing to family difficulties.
4. That your petitioner therefore joined the executive line of the Police Department in 1899, from which he was drafted to the clerical establishment of the Head Quarter Office at Anantapur for want of an efficient man in the office establishment; that in 1905 he was transferred to Bellary District where he has been working under exceptional difficulties of Plague and Famine.
5. That in consideration of his good work as Circuit Clerk and on the recommendation of the then District Superintendent of Police Bellary your humble petitioner was permanently exempted from passing the Upper Secondary Examination, (please vide G. O. No. 453 R. Educational dated 17-8-1907 communicated to petitioner in Chief Office D. No. 613 dated 22-8-1907) and by virtue of this exemption, he was not only confirmed on Rs. 15 but had his promotions to higher grades and is now a permanent clerk drawing a salary of Rs. 25 per mensem.
6. That Your Excellency will be graciously pleased to observe that it was not by his choice the petitioner was drafted into the clerical establishment and that if he had worked in the executive branch with the same zeal as he had been working in the office establishment he would have been a Sub Inspector by this time, as observed by his superiors, and that under the present rules the educational qualifications required for a Sub Inspector are the same as are required for a clerk whose pay exceeds Rs. 20 a month, except that the former

is required to undergo training in the Provincial Training School, Velloor, which training your humble petitioner is quite willing and ready to undergo if so ordered. As to the character and capacity of the petitioner your humble petitioner begs to submit that the several recommendations of his Superior Officers on the roll submitted on petitioner's behalf for promotion to the grade of Sub Inspector speak for themselves, and this roll if not forwarded to Your Excellency in original, the petitioner humbly requests that it may be kindly sent for from the Inspector General's Office for kind perusal.

7. That your humble petitioner further begs to submit that he has been practicing Photography from his school days and has a fair knowledge of the art which is also necessary for the Executive Police Officers and that if he is trained at the Velloor School, he will be all the more useful to the department firstly as Anthropometry Sub Inspector having known Photography, secondly as a Sub Inspector for Station Charge having put in 13 years service in the department, and thirdly as Reader Sub Inspector having served as Circuit Clerk for over 4 years, and that your petitioner is a non-brahmin and physically fit for executive work and is only 36 years old.

8. That in the circumstances stated above your petitioner humbly prays that having regard to the fact that your petitioner was already exempted from the examination rules in the G. O. quoted above and to the recommendations made by all his Superior Officers, Your Excellency will be graciously pleased to further exempt him as a special case. There will be nothing wanting in him to render his work most satisfactory even though it be in the executive. The order of the Police Commission that 15 per cent of the appointments should be given to the deserving men already in service is richly applicable in petitioner's case. a/

For this act of kindness your humble petitioner will as in duty bound pray for Your Excellency's long life and prosperity.

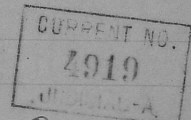

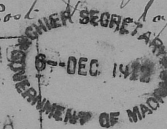

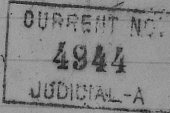
