Sir,

I am sailing on Saturday 28th December to Madras to rejoin my appointment there, but before I leave England I should like to lay my case before you.

I have had fourteen years Service in the Presidency Training-School for Mistresses, Madras, and in those years have had only two promotions. The last one made me the Second Assistant in the Training Department, while I was on furlough, when the New Scheme was passed.

All the Superintendents of the School have spoken very favourably of my work and I have had great responsibility both in the Model School and Training Department.

I stayed at my post at a small salary of 50 Rs. a month for ten years because I was very interested in my work although I could have earned three times that

that salary in posts that were offered to me out of Government Service. My first promotion with the exception of acting appointments came four years ago.

I beg to state that I have used my furlough ¹⁰⁰/₃ training in one of the best (if not the best) Training Colleges for secondary teachers, namely Cherwell Hall, Oxford, and I have done this at my own expense.

I have written to Miss Dodd, the Principal of the College, for a testimonial and I shall be pleased to forward it to you as soon as I receive it. Miss Dodd has been kind enough to praise me for the good work she said I had done during the time I spent at Cherwell Hall. I know she will be glad to be referred to with reference to my training there.

I feel I am fitted to hold a better position than the post I now hold and I have the honour to request that you will be so good as to consider my experience and faithful work and grant me a higher post.
