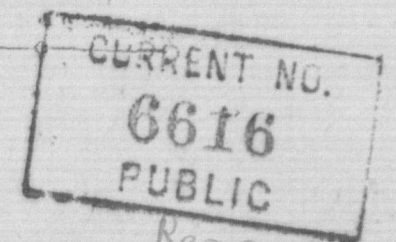

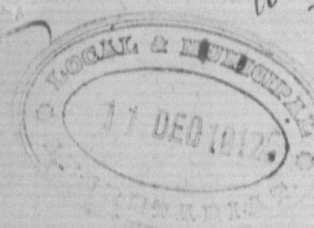

Copy of a letter No. 2574 dated 28th October 1912, from the Principal and Secretary of the Ootacamund Lawrence Asylum, Lovedale, to the ^{Superintendent} Director of Telegraphs, Madras ~~Circle~~ Calcutta ~~Office~~.

I have the honour to state that it seems probable that there will be some 16 duly qualified candidates for the Telegraph Training Class from this School for the 1913 term which starts in February next.

2. Rule 13 of the rules for conduct of the Training Class provides that "The Director General of Telegraphs shall engage to find employment as signallers for not more than 12 properly qualified boys from the class every year.

3. This rule was added apparently when recruitment throughout India was held in abeyance--and it is believed that the Department would now welcome an increase in the strength of the Class.

4. Also the rule does not explicitly limit the number of class to twelve, nor does it limit the number of appointments which the Director General may give from the class to twelve--So long as there are likely to be vacancies, there would therefore seem to be no objection, if approved of by the Director General, of any number of qualified candidates being appointed.

5. I have therefore the honour to enquire if you would kindly inform me whether the 16 boys could be drafted into the Class, and whether, if duly qualified at the end of their training, they would be appointed as signallers in the Government Telegraph Department.

S U B J E C T.

Training of additional candidates in the
Telegraph class of the Lawrence Asylum.

Under the existing rules the Director-General of Telegraphs finds employment as signallers for a maximum number of twelve properly qualified boys trained in the telegraph training class attached to the Lawrence Asylum, Ootacamund. Consequently only that number of candidates are annually trained in the Asylum. Towards the cost of this the Telegraph department contributes a sum of Rs.70 for each signaller who enters that department and the remainder of the cost is met from the Asylum funds. The latter was estimated in 1892 at Rs.640 per annum. If the proposal to train an additional four candidates is approved there will not be any additional cost to the Asylum on that account. While a sum of only Rs.60 will have to be paid to the ^{instructor or apprentice} ~~institution~~ for the additional ~~student~~ students at Rs.15 each, the Asylum will get a contribution of Rs.280 from the Telegraph Department towards their training. Presumably no increase to the pay of the instructor will be entailed by the proposal. Thus there will be a nett gain of Rs.220 to the Asylum by the proposal. There seems therefore to be no objection to ~~the~~ ^{it} ~~proposal~~. It will provide situations for ~~four~~ four
