In this office letters Nos. 476P and 6157
dated 1st August and 2nd October 1906 Messrs G.M.
Salisbury and G.W.W. Flynn were recommended for exemp-
tion from the examination rules for employment in the
Jail Department, but, in G.Os. Nos. 2652 and 3467
Educational dated 14th. August and 26th. October 1906
respectively the Government were pleased to exempt them
from the Upper Secondary Examination only for employ-
ment as European warders. These officers have performed
their duties satisfactorily and it is proposed to pro-
mote them to the higher grades in the Jail service.

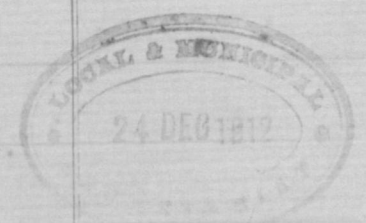
