I have had intimation from the Shipping Agents of the British India Company stating that the only boat sailing for India this month starts on 28th. My return ticket is booked on this line.

Under these circumstances, will you, very kindly, extend my leave from the 20th January 1913 to 3rd February 1913 as I shall probably arrive in Madras about that date.

I have the honour to request also, that you be so good as to grant me letters of introduction to two good Elementary and one Secondary School in London as I am anxious to visit them in order to learn something of their working which will help me in my work in India. I should like one of the Schools to be a training school.

that she had already qualified in the Practical part of the examination but it is not known whether she has passed in theory. Miss Chatterton undertook this course of study on her own initiative and also commenced to study for the Cambridge Higher Local Examination. She has since been granted a special extension of her leave for three months to enable her to sit this month for the latter examination at which she hopes to obtain honours in four subjects.

In the circumstances Lord Crewe considers that it might be professionally valuable to Miss Chatterton if she were to pay a few visits to schools in London, and he would be glad if her desire to do so could be gratified. I am accordingly to enquire whether the Board will be so good as to grant any facilities that may be required and to suggest the names of schools to which the visits might with advantage be paid.
