MY LORD MARQUESS,

We have the honour to forward the memorials which have been addressed to Your Lordship by certain members of the Indian Educational Service in the Madras Presidency and the United Provinces praying for the improvement of the pay and prospects of their service. The transmission of the memorials was delayed because the subject with which they deal was engaging the attention of the Government of India. The local Governments concerned were informed that the memorials were being withheld for this reason; and they were asked to intimate this fact to the memorialists. The formulation of proposals, however, was discontinued in view of the impending appointment of a Royal Commission on the Public Services in India. And, for the same reason, the Government of India feel themselves unable to make any recommendation at present regarding the memorials.

I have considered in Council the Letter of Your Excellency's *Memorials from certain members of the Indian Educational Service* Government in the Education Department, No. 23, dated 29th August, with which you forward memorials from certain members of the Indian Educational Service in the Madras Presidency and the United Provinces praying for an improvement of the pay and pensionary prospects of their service.

2. The questions raised in the memorials fall within the scope of the terms of reference to the Royal Commission on the Public Services in India. I have accordingly decided to bring the memorials to the notice of the Commission, and in the meantime to defer the issue of further orders on the subject.
