Gentlemen,

I have the honour to submit an application for leave for six months- on full pay for period of privilege leave due, and on furlough pay for the remainder- with effect on or after 1st April next.

I have served for 9 years as Principal of Lawrence Asylums in India- for the last 5 years at Lovedale- and during this time have had privilege leave^{only}. The Principal here acts also as Secretary and Chaplain, so that the work is ^{increasing} ~~increasing~~ and takes up the full seven days in each week. One feels also that education is making rapid strides, and that it is necessary to go home to keep oneself abreast of the times.

In accordance with precedent, I have approached the Bishop of Madras with regard to a successor. The Bishop has suggested (vide enclosed letters) the Reverend F.E. Cameron, now Chaplain of Madura, and formerly a Chaplain on the Madras Ecclesiastical Establishment- and Mr. Cameron has expressed his willingness to act. In former cases the salary of the acting Principal has been Rs. 500 per mensem.

The Committee of the Botocamuns Lawrence

With regard to the period of privilege leave for which he is now eligible it is submitted that there is no information in this office as to the date from which the privilege leave ~~was~~ sanctioned in G.O. No. 510-20¹, dated 29th August 1910 was availed of by him and when he returned to duty. The Committee of the Lawrence Asylum may be requested to furnish information on this point. A draft memo is placed below for approval.

2. Under article 308 of the C.S.R. Mr. Padfield is not ^(now) eligible for furlough as he has not rendered eight years' active service. He can, however, take furlough on the production of a medical certificate. As the committee strongly recommends the grant of the leave it may perhaps be ~~granted~~ sanctioned in relaxation of the rules of the C.S.R.

Privilege leave

The Rev. Padfield rejoined duty after three months' privilege leave on the 28th February 1911. On the 1st April 1913, he would have put in a service of 25 months & 4 days, for which he will be eligible for privilege leave for 2 months & 8 days.

Furlough

The Principal applies for furlough for 3 months & 22 days. As pointed out above, he ^{is} ~~is~~ not ~~was~~ eligible for it under the rules.

Mr. Radfield apparently wants his service at Murree prior to his appointment at Lovedale should also be counted for furlough. This is not obviously admissible. The papers ^{relating} to his appointment do not show that he has accepted the appointment under any such stipulation.

If the leave is therefore granted, it ^{would} ~~could~~ be outside the ordinarily accepted rules, viz: the C.S.R. Please see, however, the Secretary's note, dated 5.3.01 on page 2 of notes with G.O. No. 130. ED, of 7.3.01 in which it was pointed out that "leave rules do not apply to the institution." In para 1(4) of G.O. No. 231. ED, of 25.3.08, the Committee was asked to see that the provisions of the C.S.R. are applied to acting & casual allowance to the staff of the institution, but ~~that~~ it was pointed out ^{that} that the C.S.R. could not be applied in their entirety to the Asylum & that more latitude was necessary.

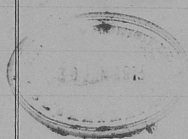

The Civil Surgeon Regulations do not apply. There is no objection to the grant of the combined leave, on the analogy of the regulations, to W. P. Field. He tells me that, if it were desired, he would produce a medical certificate or be willing to have it been treated as "very private affairs".

In these circumstances I do not think we need go behind the Committee's recommendation. The Soc. may approve six months leave for which the first two months and ^{ten} days may be on full pay & the balance on half pay.

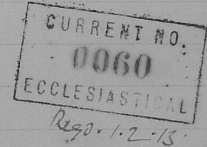
